ENGAGED KNOWLEDGE BUILDING

Engaged Knowledge Building (EKB) is our distinctive area of functioning. EKB is a phrase we have used to denote the process of learning through engagement. Engagement, which denotes hands-on experience provided to students, is practiced passionately by the college- its teachers, staff, students and alumni. This passion is however informed, disciplined and evaluated by the principles of engaged learning. Theory informs practice and practice is brought back to classroom for deliberations. Students are encouraged and often mandated to engage in learning at 4 levels: A) curricular engagement, B) co-curricular engagement; C) extra-curricular engagement and D) community engagement.

The advantage of being a college with a small student population is that it becomes easier to mobilize the participation of all students in the process of engaged knowledge building. All our students are thus fully involved in the activities of the college.

A) Curricular engagement:

• Curricular engagement happens through a number of practices that are part of the curriculum like seminars, assignments, exposure visits, field work, action research projects, lab, dissertation etc. All students submit 4-5 assignments and make 4-5 seminar presentations in a year. Debates, quizzes, film screenings etc. are also organized as part of curricular activities.

- C) **Extra-curricular engagement:** Under extra-curricular engagement, students actively lead and take part in a number of activities that build their capabilities.
 - PIME (Planning-Implementation-Monitoring-Evaluation) is a best practice we use in this regard to build team work, leadership and organizing skills of students. The activities of Loyola Extension Services (LES) are summarized below:

1) LOYOLA FAMILY COUNSELLING CENTRE (LFCC): LFCC has been functioning in Loyola Extension Services (LES) for the last 31 years. LFCC is financially aided by the Central Social Welfare Board through Kerala State Social Welfare Board. LFCC provides counseling services to people facing various crisis situations. It also collaborates with other institutions, offering counseling services to the inmates at the State Institute of Mentally Challenged (SIMC), Pangappara, Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala State Women's Commission (WC), LBS Engineering College, Poojappura and Navajyothi Rehabilitation Centre for Girls, Kariyavattom, Trivandrum. The counselors at LFCC also attend counseling sessions every week at the Family Court in Nedumangadu. During 2016-17, 1225 new cases were registered at LFCC and its outreach centres. The cases fall largely under the categories of problems such as marital, family, child, adolescent, psychiatric, alcoholic, career or educational. During this year LFCC conducted 23 awareness sessions for various groups. Mrs. Pushpa Bai conducted a Radio talk on 31-10-2016 on "How to overcome Social Media

- addiction". Mrs. Pushpa Bai presented a paper on "Impressions of Psychology in Advaita Vedanta' organized by Indian Council of Philosophical Research, New Delhi at Brahma Vidya Mandiram Hall, Varkala.
- 2) CHILDLINE THIRUVANANTHAPURAM NODAL: CHILDLINE the 24 hour emergency outreach program for children under the Ministry of Women and Child Development is present district of Trivandrum since 2000. During the year 2016 -17, CHILDLINE Trivandrum, in collaboration with Don Bosco Veedu Society and TSSS conducted 600 Awareness Programs, 8 Open Houses, 216 Schools Visits, 144 Slums/Community Visits, 155 Police Station visits, 366 Railway station visits, 366 Bus stations visits, 156 Children's Group programs, 58 SHG Group awareness and Intervened in 1615 cases out of which 645 were protection of children from abuse. 136 trainings were conducted for different stake holders of CHILDLINE.
 - Child Related Day Observances: CHILDLINE Se Dosti; the nationwide campaign was observed in Trivandrum with Komal Video Presentation, awareness classes, Bike rally, pasting POCSO posters in Police stations Nov-14 to 21st, 2016.
 - Global Hand Washing Day: On October 15th, global hand washing day program was conducted in Thycaud School with demonstration of hand washing and awareness classes. Swacch Bharath Abhiyan conducted in supporting the MWCD at Don Bosco Nivas and Karuna Nivas.
 - Review and Mapping: CHILDLINE Trivandrum Nodal was given the task for coordinating the review and mapping of Child Care Institutions in Trivandrum, Kollam, Alapuzha and Pathanamthitta Districts. During this process 10 teams along with the representatives from District Administration visited 255 CCIs in four districts.
 - Novel interventions during the year: i) Auto Suhrithukolpam: Whatsapp group and volunteers group of auto drivers created; ii) Balasauhridam: Training to Anganwadi workers; iii) Balamritham: Training to Nursing students; iv) Komal video presentation at Shanghumugham Beach; v) Attukal Awareness and Exhibition covering thousands of people; vi) Hand washing day observance in schools; vii) Child Protection Posters distributed to all

- Police stations; viii) Child Protection posters in all 582 coaches; ix) Awareness through media, AIR, Door Darshan and Selfie program; 8) Substance abuse survey among children; x) Sparsham Campaign: One month long campaign on child sexual abuse prevention, conducted 16 programs
- 3) LOYOLA LEGAL COUNSELLING CENTRE: To implement the provisions of the DV Act, 2005, LES was selected as the Service Providing Centre by the Kerala State Social Welfare Board with effect from 1st Sept. 2008. LLCC functions with financial assistance from under a programme for preventing domestic violence against women by Social Justice Department Government of Kerala. It offers free legal aid, counselling service, medical care and compensations under DV Act, 2005. The activities of Loyola Legal Counselling Centre were held at Anjengo from April 2016 to March 2017. As part of awareness programmes to the community, the legal counsellors of LLCC organized 5 sessions and a Sub-Committee meeting to plan and evaluate the activities of the centre during the reporting period. 89 cases were registered this year under the centre.
- 4) **COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME:** LES has organized Loyola Vanitha Sangham (LVS) of women in nearby areas as part of the community involvement. The main objective of LVS is the integral development of women and children. The major activities of LVS during the period 2016-17 are:
 - Awareness classes for ICDS adolescent groups under Kazhakoottam and Vattiyoorkavu block.
 - Conducted a session on Health & Hygiene for the students of Govt. High School, Sreekariyam.
 - Conducted field visits to various colonies with Swedish and German students.
 - An amount of Rs 10,000 was given by LES to a BPL family for heart surgery.
 - Four MSW students were place in four communities for their field work this year at Vikas Nagar, Cheruvickal, Kaniyamkulam and Korakulam colonies. As part of their field work, students organised camps, awareness programmes for women and children and youth in their communities.
- 5) **KERALA CHILD RIGHTS OBSERVATORY:** Kerala Child Rights Observatory (KeCRO) is a platform for sharing experiences and concerns for promoting Child Rights in the State of Kerala in consonance with the United Nations Convention on the Rights of

the Child. KeCRO is a consortium of Non-Governmental Organizations, Academic Institutions and Network Organizations conceptualized with the initiative and support of UNICEF. Under KeCRO, the following programmes were conducted this year:
