#### Annual Plans 2020-2021

#### Minutes of the Review and Planning Meeting for June 2017- March 2018

The Annual Evaluation held in April 2017 considered the feedback from various forums including staff meetings and the Open House regarding the curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities during the previous year. The following are some of the reflections:

The faculty were generally happy about the outcome of their efforts. The field practice went good and there were a host of activities that the students were able to come up with besides ample engagement with Sweden and South Africa which we were able to capitalise in terms of visibility to Loyola Social Work. Evaluation of Summer Block Placement yielded us good reflections and more than satisfactory outcomes.

- 1. Having expired a life cycle of 5 years, it was imminent to revise the Syllabus in place since 2013; it was suggested that we discuss:
  - a. brain-storm and discuss with experts to be called for the syllabus revision workshop;
  - b. discuss core competencies and quality needed in the students after two years of training.

#### Minutes of the Review and Planning Meeting for June 2016- March 2017

The Annual Evaluation held in April 2016 considered the feedback from various forums including class discussions, staff meetings and the Open House regarding the curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities during the previous year. The following are some of the reflections:

- Fr.Charles explained of his pre-retirement plans; he planned to be available till the end of the classes for Sem-IV (except on Fridays) and simultaneously offered to complete the portions for Sem-II. #### General Evaluation of the Previous Year- Online Vs Offline

The faculty members experienced the online classes as relatively a good opportunity to cover the portions on time without any distractions. The online mechanisms helped to pool in resources of practicing managers to augment the learning experiences of the students. 11 practicing managers could interact with students on various subjects of relevance. The students also got an opportunity to attend several online programmes during the academic year. The main webinars on various codes were a real insightful inputs for them. The webinar organised by B2B consultants was very comprehensive and relevant for students. One of the challenges experienced in online learning is lack of facility for group excercises. But this could be resolved by learning the break up room facility in zoom. Thanks to Mr.Adrews for facilitating our teachers on the same.

The online internship was altogether a novel experience to all stakeholders like students, faculty and the industrial mentors. We could tap maximum inputs and insights from 20 different organisations. During the period we could also organise 4 webinars on various relevant themes, which was attended by a cross section of people across the country. The resource persons were all experts in the field and we could get a good feedback from the participants of the webinars. All our efforts were possible only with the support of our alumni members. A big thanks to all the beloved alumni members for supporting our efforts in grooming HRM students.

We also used Moodle as a reliable platform for transacting with students during the time of lock down and pandemic. It was again a different experience to the students to interact through such a platform for teaching learning purpose to the full extent. We also organised bridge course to the new batch of 2020, which was found to be very useful for the students. Again the practitioners inputs during the bridge course added value to the whole programme. The offline classes from January onwards got distracted with several college level activites during the season. We could not proceed to cover the portions as we planned.




