The first session dealt with Epistemology and Ontology of Research handled by Dr. Saji P Jacob. He was clear in differentiating between ontology (study the nature of reality), epistemology (study of the nature of the knowledge), and axiology (study of values). Dr. Prakash delivered the session on quantitative research. He simplified the content and explained the thrust areas by using a flow chart. Quantitative research is an approach of testing objective theories by examining the relationship between variables whereas qualitative research is an approach of explaining and understanding meaning individuals or groups ascribe to a social or human problem. Mr. Prasad explained in detail the ethnographic writing which differs from other types of academic, historic, or journalist writing. The hallmark of theethnographic research methodology includes participant observation and field study. Dr. Jasmine Sera was taken a session on literature Review and Intellectual Property Rights through Moodle platform. It was something creative and interesting. The resource person reminded that to gain preliminary orientation, a background of knowledge, to gain up-to-date knowledge in the field, to identify gaps, and avoid duplication review of literature is

mandatory.Last day's session was taken by Dr. Antony Palakkal, Head of the Sociology Department, Kariavattom, University of Kerala.Dr. Antony's session threw light on scientific writing. Publication proves once practical knowledge, hands-on experience, skills, and expertise in that particular field. He reminded that the more you read and write the more fluent you become. And then, the Chief Guest and the Resource Person distributed certificates to all the participants and conducted an online feedback session after the valedictory function.
