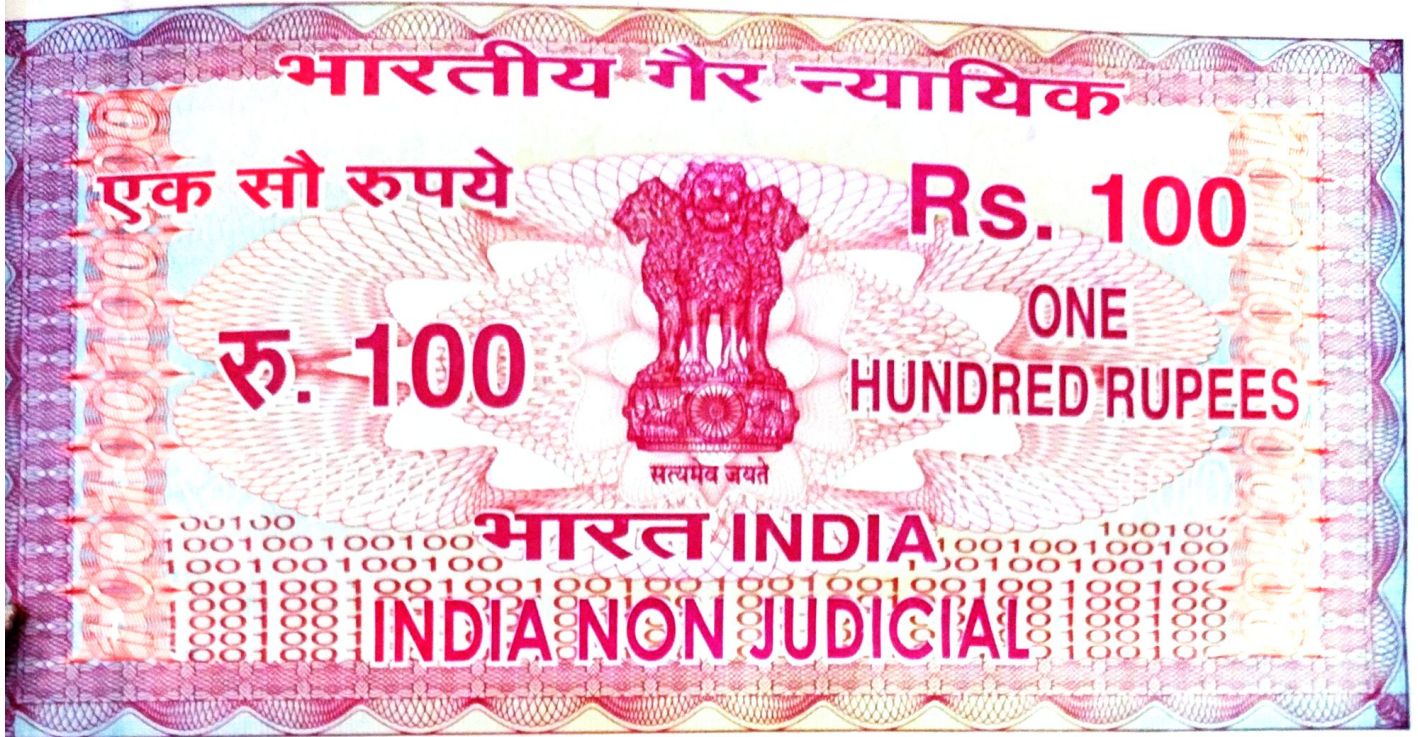

(First Party, Second Party and Third Party are hereinafter jointly referred to as 'Parties' and individually as 'Party')

WHEREAS:

A) All the three parties are Higher Educational Institutions

B) All parties believe that collaboration and co-operation between themselves will promote more effective use of each of their resources, and provide each of them with enhanced opportunities.

C) The Parties intent to cooperate and focus their efforts on cooperation within the area of Skill Based Training, Education and Research.

D) The Parties, being legal entities in themselves desire to sign this MoU for advancing their mutual interests.

NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL PROMISES SET FORTH IN THIS MoU, THE PARTIES HERE TO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

CLAUSE 1

CO-OPERATION

1.1 All Parties are united by common interests and objectives, and they shall establish channels of communication and co-operation that will promote and advance their respective operations within the Institution and its related wings. The Parties shall keep each other informed of potential opportunities and shall share all information that may be relevant to secure additional opportunities for one another.

1.2 Inter party co-operation will facilitate effective utilization of the intellectual capabilities of the faculty of parties providing significant inputs to each other in developing suitable teaching / training systems, keeping in mind the needs of the students, staff and industry.

1.3 The general terms of co-operation shall be governed by this MoU. The Parties shall cooperate with each other and shall, as promptly as is reasonably practical, enter into all relevant agreements, deeds and documents (the 'Definitive Documents') as may be required to give effect to the actions contemplated in terms of this MoU. The term of Definitive Documents shall be mutually decided between the Parties. Along with the Definitive Documents, this MoU shall represent the entire understanding as to the subject matter hereof and shall supersede any prior understanding between the Parties on the subject matter hereof.

CLAUSE 2

SCOPE OF THE MoU

2.1 The MoU envisages all three parties to jointly design short term training programmes (value added courses/ add-on courses/Joint certificate programmes etc.) to provide skill sets beyond the University curriculum for the various stake holders of the parties. The budding graduates from the institutions could play a key role in technological up-gradation, innovation and competitiveness of an industry. All parties believe that close co-operation between the parties would be of major benefit to the student community to enhance their skills and knowledge.

2.2 Curriculum Design: All parties will give valuable inputs in teaching / training methodology and suitably customize the curriculum so that the students fit into the industrial scenario

meaningfully. The Parties also shall take up Faculty Development Programmes for various skill requirements of the three institutes as well as for the general public.

2.3 Research and Development: All parties have agreed to carry out joint research activities in the fields of mutual interest.

2.4 Skill Development Programs: Faculty of all three parties will voluntarily train the students on the emerging technologies in order to bridge the skill gap and make them industry ready.

2.5 All Parties to obtain all internal approvals, consents, permissions, and licenses of whatsoever nature required for offering the Programmes on the terms specified herein

2.6 There is no financial commitment on the part of all parties to take up any programme mentioned in the MoU. If there is any financial consideration, it will be dealt separately.

2.7 Certificates: The certificates issued to the participants shall be jointly signed by the authorities of the three parties.

CLAUSE 3

INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

3.1 Nothing contained in this MoU shall, by express grant, implication, Estoppel or otherwise, create in any Party any right, title, interest, or license in or to the intellectual property (including but not limited to know-how, inventions, patents, copy rights and designs) of the other Parties.

CLAUSE 4

VALIDITY

4.1 This Agreement will be valid for a period of five years

4.2 All Parties may terminate this MoU upon 30 calendar days' notice in writing. In the event of Termination, all parties have to discharge their obligations

CLAUSE 5

RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE PARTIES

5.1 It is expressly agreed that all parties are acting under this MoU as independent contractors, and the relationship established under this MoU shall not be construed as a partnership. No Party is authorized to use the other Party's name in any way, to make any representations or create any obligation or liability, expressed or implied, on behalf of the other Party, without the prior written consent of the other Party. No Party shall have, nor represent itself as having, any authority under the terms of this MoU to make agreements of any kind in the name of or binding upon the other Party/Parties, to pledge the other Party's credit, or to extend credit on behalf of the other Party/parties.

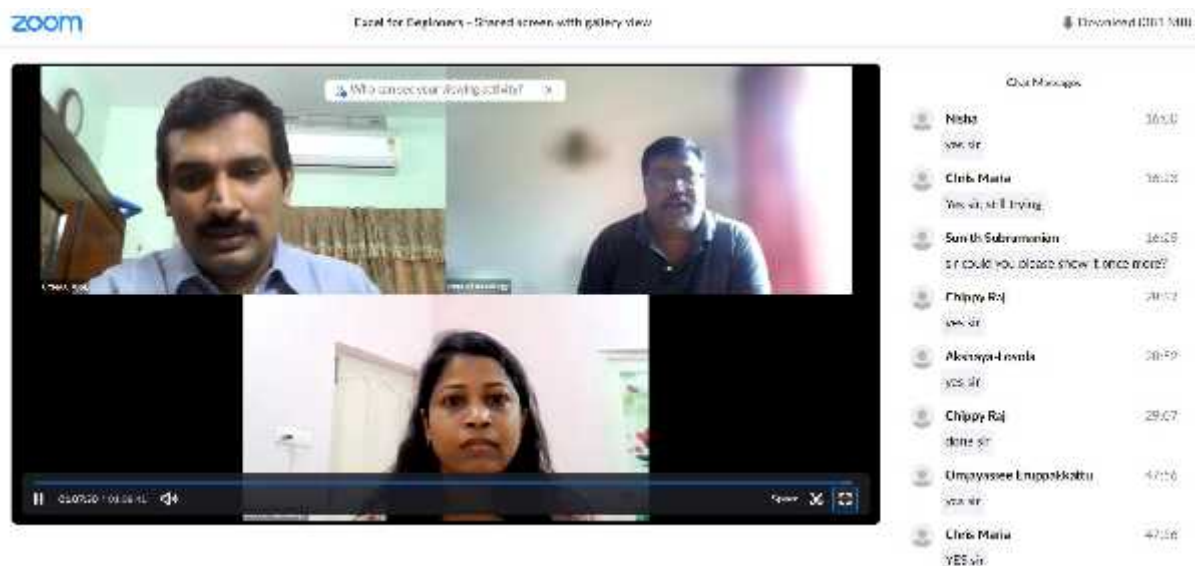


The content of the program for both workshops were:
