




#### **Blood Donation Day-2020**

## **Independence Day Celebration-2016**



# AIDS DAY AWARNESS PROGRAMME-2020





## Martyrs Day-2021






## **National Handloom Day**





# Hepatitis Day- Free Hepatitis Detection Camp

Hepatitis B is a silent killer which is often unknown. Only 5% out of 400 million of the total affected population knows that they are affected by this disease. In India, 20 million is affected by the virus, out of which 20 lakhs are in Kerala Hepatitis B infection may lead to liver failures and cancers.



Over 7000 die every year due to liver failure as a result of undetected Hepatitis B infection. If detected Hepatitis B is a fully curable disease. In view of this alarming fact NSS organized a free Hepatitis B detection camp and awareness generation on 28 July 2016 in the college. The day is observed as World Hepatitis day and the theme of the year 2016 was 'Know Hepatitis'. The camp started at 2.00 p.m. with an awareness class of Dr. K.R Vinaya Kumar, a well-known humanist gastroenterologist with a very special concern for liver diseases. He is the Dean of Travancore Medicity Medical College and the Director of the Digestive Diseases Division of Lords hospital Trivandrum. He gave a description of how hepatitis can be identified and treated. He pointed out that it is curable but if not detected it may leading to cancer. In the end of the awareness class the floor was opened up for raising questions. Dr. Vinaya Kumar clarified all doubts of the audience. It was a useful session to students and teachers. It helped in gaining deeper understanding about the silent killer disease.

There after collected Dr. Vinaya Kumar along with his two technicians collected blood samples from students and teachers and non- teaching staff of the college for identifying hepatitis. The results of the same were announced after one hour. The Free Detection Camp came to an end at 4.30pm. Blood samples of all the students, teachers and non-teaching staff were collected and tested in the camp.
