ANNUAL REPORT (2016-2017)

01. INTRODUCTION

The ultimate goal of LES is to enable and empower the marginalized and the vulnerable, extending services to rural and urban community development initiatives and thus functioning as a field laboratory where the classroom concepts and theories of Social Sciences can be field-tested, adapted and applied. LES has played pivotal roles in starting many social work interventions in the State of Kerala with a vision to the “Integral Development of all human beings and social transformation”. The Mission of LES is to function as a vibrant extension wing of the Loyola College of Social Sciences; mobilizing and empowering people through training, and activating them in participatory development initiatives in a sustainable framework. This report covers the activities from April 2016 to March 2017. During the period under report, LES concentrated more on training programmes and Child Rights activities. The following are the department wise activities during the period under report.

02. LOYOLA FAMILY COUNSELLING CENTRE (LFCC)

Loyola Family Counselling Centre (LFCC) has been functioning in Loyola Extension Services (LES) for the last 31 years. LFCC is financially aided by the Central Social Welfare Board through Kerala State Social Welfare Board. LFCC provides counseling services to people facing various crisis situations. It also collaborates with other institutions, offering counseling services to the inmates at the State Institute of Mentally Challenged (SIMC), Pangappara, Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala State Women’s Commission (WC), LBS Engineering College, Poojappura and Navajyothi Rehabilitation Centre for Girls, Kariyavattom, Trivandrum. The counselors at LFCC also attend counseling sessions every week at the Family Court in Nedumangadu.

The activities of Loyola Family Counselling Centre from April 2016 through March 2017 are as follows.

During the reporting period, 1225 new cases were registered at LFCC and its outreach centers. The cases fall largely under the categories of problems such as marital, family, child, adolescent, psychiatric, alcoholic, career or educational. During this year LFCC conducted 23 awareness sessions for various groups. Mrs. Pushpa Bai conducted a Radio talk on 31-10-2016 about ‘kmaq-ly-am-[y-a-šÄ XoÀ;p¶ ASn-aXz-ñÂ \n¶pw F§s\ tam-N\w t\Smw’ . Mrs. Pushpa Bai presented a

03. CHILDLINE THIRUVANANTHAPURAM - NODAL

CHILDLINE the 24 hour emergency outreach program for children under the Ministry of Women and Child Development is present district of Trivandrum since 2000. During the year 2016 -17, CHILDLINE Trivandrum, in collaboration with Don Bosco Veedu Society and TSSS conducted 600 Awareness Programs, 8 Open Houses, 216 Schools Visits, 144 Slums/Community Visits, 155 Police Station visits, 366 Railway station visits, 366 Bus stations visits, 156 Children’s Group programs, 58 SHG Group awareness and Intervened 1615 cases out of which 645 were protection of children from abuse. 136 trainings were conducted to different stake holders of CHILDLINE.

Trainings Conducted: 136 trainings were conducted in the year 2016-17 for different stake holders. It includes 5 major Staff training in different subjects, *Balasauhrdam* to sensitize the Anganwady teachers /helpers on child related laws. Fr. Joye James, Director of CHILDLINE Nodal organization lead 17 sessions on child protection and laws for Principals of Aided Higher Secondary schools at SIEMAT, Trivandrum.

During the fiscal year CHILDLINE attended two DCPC Meeting in the Chairmanship of Sri. District Panchayath president and every month a follow up meeting is conducted with the chairman ship of district Collector. CHILDLINE Nodal Director and Coordinator visited different Departments’ district’s and State heads as allied system visit and for strengthening the network.

Child Related Day observances: CHILDLINE Se Dosti; the nationwide campaign was observed in Trivandrum with Komal Video Presentation, awareness classes, Bike rally, pasting POCSO posters in Police stations Nov-14 to 21st, 2016.

Global Hand washing day, October 15th: Global hand washing day program was conducted in Thycaud School with demonstration of hand washing and awareness classes. Swatchbharath Abhiyan conducted in supporting the MWCD at Don Bosco Nivas and Karuna Nivas.

Review and Mapping: CHILDLINE Trivandrum Nodal was given the task for coordinating the review and mapping of Child Care Institutions in Trivandrum, Kollam, Alapuzha and

Pathanamthitta Districts. During this process 10 teams along with the representatives from District Administration visited 255 CCIs in four districts.

Meetings: Continuous Meetings were conducted in order to assess the activities and case interventions. During this year CHILDLINE Trivandrum conducted 3 Directors Meetings, 12 Coordinators Meetings, six meeting with DCPU and 2 DCPC meetings.

LLCC functions with financial assistance from Kerala State Social Welfare Board under a programme for preventing domestic violence against women by Social Justice Department Government of Kerala. It offers free legal aid, counselling service, medical care and compensations under DV Act, 2005. The activities of Loyola Legal Counselling Centre were held at Anjengo from April 2016 to March 2017.

ANNUAL REPORT (2018-2019)

01. INTRODUCTION

The ultimate goal of LES is to enable and empower the marginalized and the vulnerable, extending services to rural and urban community development initiatives and thus functioning as a field laboratory where the classroom concepts and theories of Social Sciences can be field-tested, adapted and applied. LES has played pivotal roles in starting many social work interventions in the State of Kerala with a vision to the “Integral Development of all human beings and social transformation”. The Mission of LES is to function as a vibrant extension wing of the Loyola College of Social Sciences; mobilizing and empowering people through training, and activating them in participatory development initiatives in a sustainable framework. This report covers the activities from April 2018 to March 2019. During the period under report, LES concentrated more on training programmes and Child Rights activities. The following are the department wise activities during the period under report.

02. LOYOLA FAMILY COUNSELLING CENTRE (LFCC)

Loyola Family Counselling Centre (LFCC) has been functioning in Loyola Extension Services (LES) for the last 32 years. LFCC is financially aided by the Central Social Welfare Board through Kerala State Social Welfare Board. LFCC provides counseling services to people facing various crisis situations. It also collaborates with other institutions, offering counseling services to Kerala State Women’s Commission (WC), LBS Engineering College, Poojappura and Navajyothi Rehabilitation Centre for Girls, Kariyavattom, Trivandrum. One counselor of LFCC also attend counseling sessions every week at the Family Court in Nedumangadu.

The activities of Loyola Family Counseling Centre from April 2018 through March 2019 are as follows.

During the reporting period, 679 new cases were registered at LFCC and its outreach centres. The cases fall largely under the categories of problems such as marital, family,

child, adolescent, psychiatric, alcoholic, career or educational. During this year LFCC conducted 70 awareness sessions for various groups.

03. CHILDLINE NODAL AGENCY THIRUVANANTHAPURAM

CHILDLINE the 24 hour emergency outreach program for children under the Ministry of Women and Child Development is present district of Trivandrum since 2000. During the year 2018 -19, CHILDLINE Trivandrum, in collaboration with Don Bosco Veedu Society, Railway Child Help Desk and TSSS conducted 1013 outreach and Awareness 8 Open Houses, 430 Schools Visits, 223 Police Station visits, 365 Railway station visits, 365 Bus stations visits, 26 SHG Group awareness and Intervened 2513 cases 124 trainings were conducted to different stake holders of CHILDLINE

Major Awareness Programs: In order to reach the public, mass awareness were conducted during the Vettukadu festival and Attukal Ponkala

Trainings Conducted: 124 trainings were conducted in the year 2018-19 for different stake holders and 6 Staff training in different subjects. Stake holders training includes Police-20, Teachers-14, Health department-1, DLSA -1, LSG-1, Railway 3, SC and ST-9, ICDS, school counsellors and others.

Child Related Day observances: CHILDLINE Se Dosti, the nationwide campaign was observed in Trivandrum with Komal Video Presentation, awareness classes, Awareness at Club Fm.

Global Hand washing day, October 11th: Global hand washing day program was conducted in Thycaud School with demonstration of hand washing and awareness classes.

Meetings: Continuous Meetings are conducted in order to assess the activities and case interventions. During this year CHILDLINE Trivandrum conducted 2 Directors Meetings, 12 Coordinators Meetings, 2 DCPC meetings, 2 volunteers meeting.

During the fiscal year CHILDLINE conducted two DCPC Meetings in the Chairmanship of Sri. Madhu, District Panchayath president and every month a follow up meeting is conducted with the chairmanship of District Collector. CHILDLINE Nodal Director and Coordinator visited different Departments' Districts and State heads as allied system visit and for strengthening the network.

Innovations:

- ✓ Praveshnothsavam conducted at Amboory Puravimala School and in collaboration with Sanchari FB online travel group; study materials were distributed to tribal students.
- ✓ On 12/10/18 Mr Jobi participated in Samoohyapatam program, one hour discussion session on child Rights and Child Protection aired in DOORDARSHAN TV Chanel.
- ✓ Training given to two CWPO from entire Police Stations of Kerala in collaboration with UNICEF and Kerala Police Academy, Trissur. A total number of 960 police officers were trained as Child Welfare police officers.
- ✓ Training given to all School HMs and Principals of schools of Kerala on Child Protection in collaboration with SCERT and SIEMAT
- ✓ Collaborated with ORC to give training to selected children in different schools on child protection and life Skills -SMART 40
- ✓ In collaboration with Tribal Department and ORC, trainings on child protection was given to teachers and students of Tribal Schools
- ✓ A pocket diary and calendar was printed and distributed among stake holders and departments
- ✓ A youth volunteers group has been created and being made use for the awareness creation.
- ✓ In collaboration with IU Vellayambalam training is being given to Brides and Bridegrooms on parenting and child Protection.

04. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

LES has organized Loyola Vanitha Sangham (LVS) of women in nearby areas as part of the community involvement. The main objective of LVS is the integral development of women and children. The major activities of LVS during the period 2018-19 are:

-] Awareness classes for ICDS adolescent groups under Kazhakuttom block.
-] Conducted a session on Health & Hygiene for mothers in Chamavila Anganwadi.

-)] Three MSW students were placed in 3 communities for their field work this year at Chamavila, Cheruvickal and Ayodhya Nagar colonies. As part of their field work, students organised a nutrition camp at Chamavila colony.

05. KERALA CHILD RIGHTS OBSERVATORY

Kerala Child Rights Observatory (KeCRO) is a platform for sharing insights, experiences and concerns for promoting Child Rights in the State of Kerala in consonance with the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child. KeCRO is a consortium of Non-Governmental Organizations, Academic Institutions and Network Organizations conceptualized with the initiative and support of UNICEF. KeCRO was formally inaugurated in 2014. During the year 2018 - 19, KeCRO was involved with various activities like NGO workshops, Social Media workshops for Youth, Journalists Workshops, Communication workshops for MR campaign, Media Scanning, Youth Engagement Programmes, Media Awards etc.

Loyola Extension Services (LES) is a multi-dimensional extension and outreach Centre equipped to train and guide college students, teachers, professionals, NGO and GO personnel and community leaders. LES functions as a social lab or field laboratory where the classroom concepts and theories of Social Sciences are field-tested, adapted and applied. LES has designed and conducted various state level and national level training programmes. The annual report has three parts. The first part of the annual report presents the vision, mission and the over-all goals of LES. The second part of the annual report depicts the regular programmes and activities of this year. The third part of the report will showcase the unique ventures of LES in this year.

02. VISION AND MISSION OF LES

Poojappura and Navajyothi Rehabilitation Centre for Girls, Kariyavattom, Trivandrum. One of the counselors of LFCC also attends counseling sessions every week at the Family Court in Nedumangadu.

The activities of Loyola Family Counseling Centre from April 2019 to March 2020 are as follows.

During the reporting period, 973 new cases were registered at LFCC and its outreach centres. The cases fall largely under the categories of problems such as marital, family, child, adolescent, psychiatric, alcoholic, career or educational. During this year LFCC conducted 70 awareness sessions for various groups. Mrs.Pushpa Bai attended Neuro Linguistic Programming (NLP) conducted by Fr. Tobby S J.

The counsellors regularly imparted parents training and counseling to the inmates of State Institute for Mentally Challenged, Pangappara. They also provided sessions on creative parenting twice in a month at TSSS, Trivandrum as part of Pre-marital Counselling Course. Sessions on Psychological Intervention with sick people were given to BSc Nursing students twice in a month. The details of counselling cases are given below.

04. CHILDLINE NODAL AGENCY THIRUVANANTHAPURAM

CHILDLINE the 24 hour emergency outreach program for children under the Ministry of Women and Child Development is present in the district of Trivandrum since 2000. During the year 2019 -20, Childline organized 24 Open Houses to identify the issues of children at the local level. 396 Railway station visits, 396 Bus stations visits were also carried out by

Childline. It intervened in **2290** cases of which 174 child sexual abuse cases and 271 physical abuse cases.

Major Awareness Programmes: In order to reach the public, mass awareness programmes were conducted during the AttukalPonkala and Childline se Dostiprogramme.

Trainings and Awareness Session Conducted: A major programme called **run for safe childhood** was initiated to reach a large public. 144 trainings were organized in the year 2019-20 for 23 different stake holders such as Anganwady workers and helpers-2, students-14, parents-2, Tribal parents and children-2, catechism teachers-2, School teachers/HMs-12, elected representatives and VCPC members-5, sports coaches -1, kudumbashree-1, college students-3, NSSS-3, smart 40 under dcpcu-8, GRPF and RPF-3, social workers-2, Mentally challenged children-1, Counsellors-2, BCPC members-1, JPHN and health workers-2, DCPC members-1 Childline Volunteers-5, Priests -1 and others-71.

CAB (Childline Advisory Board) and DCPC (District Child Protection Committee) Meeting: During this year CHILDLINE conducted one CAB meeting under the leadership of district collector, in which 11 circulars were given to different child related departments.3 DCPC meetings were organised under the Chairmanship of Sri.Madhu District Panchayat President and follow up meetings were conducted under the chairmanship of district Collector . CHILDLINE Nodal Director and Coordinator visited Heads of different district and State Departments as allied system visits for strengthening the network.

Child Related Day observances: CHILDLINE Se Dosthi(CSD) the nationwide campaign was observed in Trivandrum along with other day observances, like Anti child Labour day, girl child day etc.,

Swatch Bharath Abhiyan: Loyola Extension services played a major role in conducting 12 unique awareness programmes on health and hygiene and environmental protection in tribal settlement, workshop mechanics, volunteers and reached 1600 people directly.

Meetings: Continuous Meetings were conducted during the year in order to assess the activities and case interventions. During this year CHILDLINE Trivandrum conducted 1 CAB Meeting, 3 Directors Meetings, 12 Coordinators Meetings, 2 meetings with DCPU and 3 DCPC meetings.

05. TRAINING THE STUDENTS OF LOYOLA COLLEGE

Loyola Extension Services imparts various trainings to the students of Loyola College. Childline organized exclusive trainings for the students of social work and sociology on the project Drug Free Panchayat. The faculty members of Loyola College extend their expertise for various trainings conducted at LES. They collaborate with LES for training the students such as Street theatre, environmental protection and media.

06. UNIQUE AND INNOVATIVE PROGRAMMES

Manthra-Training Programmes: LES designed a unique training programme for teachers, counsellors and child rights activists for three days. It was a residential training programme to mould the minds of participants to be child rights activists. LES organized two Manthra trainings.

Collaboration with Inspire and MAD: Inspire (NGO by the students of Government Engineering College, Barttan Hill) in collaboration with LES and social work students of Loyola College hosted a three day live-in camp experience for the children of orphanages, children's homes of Trivandrum. Social work students gave sessions on Life Skills to these children. MAD (Make A Difference) conducted a three-day residential training programme for the children of orphanages, children's homes of Trivandrum with major financial subsidy from LES. LES collaborated in life changing trainings of these two organisations.

Childline was spearheading many creative initiatives of LES this year.

01. INTRODUCTION

Loyola Extension Services (LES) is a multi-dimensional extension and outreach Centre equipped to train and guide college students, teachers, professionals, NGO and GO personnel and community leaders. LES functions as a social lab or field laboratory where the classroom concepts and theories of Social Sciences are field-tested, adapted and applied. LES has designed and conducted various state level and national level training programmes. The annual report has three parts. The first part of the annual report presents the vision, mission and the over-all goals of LES. The second part of the annual report depicts the regular programmes and activities of this year. The third part of the report will showcase the unique ventures of LES in this year.

02. VISION AND MISSION OF LES

Vision: Integral Development of all human beings and social development

Mission: To function as a vibrant extension wing of the Loyola College of Social Sciences, empowering people through training and activating them in participatory development initiatives in a sustainable framework.

The ultimate goal of LES is to enable and empower the marginalized and the vulnerable sections of society, and extend services to rural and urban community development initiatives and thus function as a field laboratory where the classroom concepts and theories of Social Sciences are field-tested, adapted and applied. LES has played pivotal roles in starting many social work interventions in the State of Kerala.

This report covers the activities from April 2020 to March 2021. LES concentrated on training programmes, Child Rights activities and COVID relief works during the period

under report. The following are the department wise activities during the period under report.

03. LOYOLA FAMILY COUNSELLING CENTRE (LFCC)

Loyola Family Counselling Centre (LFCC) has been functioning in Loyola Extension Services (LES) for the last 35 years. LFCC is financially aided by the Central Social Welfare Board through Kerala State Social Welfare Board. LFCC provides counseling services to people facing various crisis situations. It also collaborates with other institutions, offering counseling services to Kerala State Women's Commission (WC), LBS Engineering College, Poojappura and Navajyothi Rehabilitation Centre for Girls, Kariyavattom, Trivandrum. One of the counselors of LFCC also attends counseling sessions every week at the Family Court in Nedumangadu.

The activities of Loyola Family Counseling Centre from April 2020 to March 2021 are as follows.

During the reporting period, 469 new cases were registered at LFCC and its outreach centers. The cases fall largely under the categories of problems such as marital, family, child, adolescent, psychiatric, alcoholic, career or educational. During this year LFCC conducted 26 awareness sessions for various groups online.

04. CHILDLINE NODAL AGENCY THIRUVANANTHAPURAM

CHILDLINE the 24 hour emergency outreach program for children under the Ministry of Women and Child Development is present in the district of Trivandrum since 2000. During the year 2020 -21, CHILDLINE Trivandrum, in collaboration with Don BoscoVeedu Society and TSSS conducted Outreach and Awareness programs frequently, 17 Open Houses for identifying the issues of children at the local level were conducted and issues were solved. Schools and other child related institution visits were being done by all the partner organizations. Railway station visits and Bus stations visits were also done and Intervened in 1434 cases in which 94 child sexual abuse cases and 226 physical abuse cases.

Major Awareness Programs: In order to reach the public, mass awareness programs were conducted during Attukal Ponkala and childline se Dosti program. A major program called **Ride for safe childhood** was conducted on 19/11/2020 to reach a wide public, in which all stakeholder departments joined with CHILDLINE.

Trainings and Awareness Conducted: 15 trainings were conducted in the year 2019-20 for different stake holders. 7 Staff training in different subjects were also conducted. 10 sensitization programs were conducted for kudumbashree teachers ICDS supervisors etc. 5 training for ICDS supervisors stand out because of its uniqueness.

CAB and DCPC Meeting: During the fiscal year CHILDLINE could not conduct CAB meeting but conducted stakeholders meeting under the leadership of district collector, through which training for teachers were discussed and planned. DCPC meeting under the Chairmanship of District Panchayath president and follow up meeting were also conducted. CHILDLINE Nodal Director and Coordinator visited different Departments, district and State heads as allied system visited for strengthening the network.

Child Related Day observances: CHILDLINE Se Dosti the nationwide campaign was observed in Trivandrum along with other day observances, such as Anti child Labour day and girl child day. As part of Child Rights Day observance a state child rights quiz was planned and implemented with the participation of 582 participants all over Kerala.

Meetings: Continuous meetings were conducted in order to assess the activities and case interventions. During this year CHILDLINE Trivandrum conducted 3 Directors' Meetings, 9 Monthly Meetings and 9 Coordinators' Meetings, several online and offline meetings with DCPU and 3 DCPC meetings were also conducted during this year. 5 volunteers' meetings were conducted during the year. One resource organization meeting was conducted during the year.

Innovations:

- ▶ **Kids on Doors:** As there was a problem in giving awareness different methods were used to disseminate knowledge and awareness on child protection. As a joint effort with Malayalam online good quality videos were prepared and aired in social media for awareness creation. 12 Videos were created in the year.
- ▶ **Online Education help:** As the Covid was hit in all walks of life, children also were not able to attend classes. Though online classes started there were a huge number of children who lacked the TV or any other gadgets. Childline Trivandrum collected 23 TVs in this financial year and distributed to needy children.
- ▶ **Cabin House:** When going beyond is needed child line gone beyond for helping child to get a sponsor for his house. A cabin house was built for a child who was living in a tarpolin hut.
- ▶ **Stakeholders Meet:** A stake holders meet was planned and conducted including all departments to discuss the issues of children on 15\7\20.
- ▶ **Balasauhrdam Training:** Another unique initiative was to conduct training for ICDS supervisors on Psychological first aid for Children.
- ▶ **Strengthening Child Protection Committees:** Child Protection Committees were formed in all districts but the strengthening was done by Child line team through various trainings.

- ▶ **Champakka E-Magazine:**In order to involve children during lock down a magazine was prepared with the drawings and writings of children and it was aired in all social media. Every month the digital magazine is published.
- ▶ **6 Training for police officials** were done on the subject “child friendly policing”.
- ▶ **State Child Rights quiz:** A child right Quiz was conducted online with three rounds to spread awareness on child protection and laws related to children. First round was done in Google forms and last round was done in Google meet live in which Mr. GS Pradeep participated and inaugurated.
- ▶ 5 Trainings were conducted in **collaboration with NYK on Child protection and life skills for youth.**
- ▶ 2 Trainings were conducted for **religious leaders** on child protection and roles of religious leaders.
- ▶ Two trainings were conducted **for Para legal volunteers in collaboration with DLSA** on the subjects Child Protection and Child rights.
- ▶ Training for Mentally challenged children and note book distribution to blind children were carried out.
- ▶ Online Awareness through web series #AdhyapakareIthile was given.
- ▶ Trainings were given to Block child Protection Committee (BCPC) Members.
- ▶ Adopting two Panchayath namely Aruvikkara and Anjengo and working towards balasauhrdapanchayaths.
- ▶ **A Case Study was prepared on the intervention of building a Cabin House**

CHILDLINE Trivandrum started functioning from March 2000. This year Child line Trivandrum completed the work of twenty years.

CHILDLINE brought hope to many distressed children in the State. Our dream doesn't end until our society become a catalyst for better childhood.

05. TRAINING THE STUDENTS OF LOYOLA COLLEGE

Loyola Extension Services imparted various trainings to the students of Loyola College. Child line organized exclusive trainings for the students of social work and sociology on Life skill training. The faculty members of Loyola College extended their expertise for

various trainings conducted at LES. They collaborated with LES for training the students such as Street theatre, environmental protection and media.
