Day by Day Report

DAY-1 (December 6, 2021)

The first day of the Induction Programme 2021–'22 was on December 6th, 2021, and the venue was Sutter Hall, Loyola College of Social Sciences. The program was divided into two sessions, where the morning session was from 9:30 to 12:30, and the morning session commenced with a prayer song by 1st-year students. The welcome address was given by Fr. Dr. Sabu P. Thomas. Following the principal's remarks by Dr. Saji P Jacob, stating the vision and mission of the college, Fr. Sunny Kunnappallil (Manager) addressed the students and parents present at the hall. Then, in the hall, each department's faculty team introduced themselves.



After a short tea break, the parents and students were organized into different groups based on their department and were sent to separate venues for the departmental meeting along with their concerned faculty team. In each department parents and teachers interacted with each other. Parents were informed about the program-specific objectives, program objectives, and course objectives. After the meeting parents left the college and the students continued with induction.



Fr. Dr. Sabu P Thomas and Dr. Francina P.X gave a briefing on the Induction program and divided the students into four committees namely Programme, Logistics, Reporting and Covid protocol committee. The students came up with different names for each committee such as Gryffindor, Agneya, Synergia and Carpediem. Each session conducted in the induction enabled students to interact and know each other and also taught students that freedom comes with responsibility.




After the lunch break the evening session was commenced, where there was an interactive session from 1:10-3:00 pm by a resource Person named Mr. Sebastian Britto, who is the programme manager of Adani Foundation. This session was arranged on the topic Group Dynamics & Interpersonal skills. The welcome address was given by Ms. Shihana, a 1st-year Sociology student. Mr. Shelton, 1st year MA HRM read out the guest profile. Mr. Sebastian Britto then addressed the gathering. He divided the students into groups consisting of 10 each. He conducted a few ice-breaking activities including learning each team member's name, place, course studied which helped us to know each other. He concluded the session by a briefing on the importance of grabbing each opportunity and differentiating on skills and ability. The vote of thanks was given by Sakkiya, 1st year MA HRM.





The next session was a Campus Tour which was from 3:00–3:30 pm. The campus tour was guided by the seniors and scholars. They took us around the campus explaining each department's activities, Loyola extension services, co-curricular activities, Loyola fitness centre and Loyola knowledge resource centre. The main objective was to familiarise the students with college facilities and departments.



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
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After a short tea break, at 3:45 a quiz was conducted by the seniors based on the campus tour amongst the four groups. Every team actively participated in the quiz. Team Agneya won the quiz with maximum points.



Finally, an evaluation session was conducted from 3:45 to 4:30 pm among the students. All the students got an opportunity to express their feedback about the first-day induction programme. Some of the students gave their suggestions on the programme. The first-day induction programme concluded by briefing the next day's activities by the faculty.

DAY-2 (December 7, 2021)

The day started with a prayer song by the Programme Committee (Group 4). Followed by that, Group 3 (Synergia) presented the previous day's (6th December 2021) induction report. They opted to present the report in a news format which was very innovative and creative. Later, Vice-Principal Fr.Dr.Sabu.P.Thomas reiterated the rules and etiquettes to be maintained throughout these two years.



By 9:15 AM, Akhila Lazar from Sociology Department invited Fr. Sunny Kunnampallil, Rector and Manager of Loyola College, to give an insight regarding Ignatius Loyola, Jesuits and Ignatian Pedagogical Paradigm. He introduced us to the origin and history of the Society of Jesus. He enlightened us with the life of Saint Ignatius Loyola, an army officer driven by materialistic motives who later got into the path of divinity and re-established an identity for himself. The Society of Jesus is driven by the motto put forth by Saint Ignatius Loyola- "Ad Majorem Dei Gloriam" (For the Greater Glory of God). Fr. Sunny emphasized the word "Magis" (More) that captures the spirit of Ignatius Loyola within us. Fr. Sunny mentioned about "Ignatian Pedagogical Paradigm" which was the educational method followed by the Society of Jesus. It later got renamed "Integrated Pedagogical Paradigm".

The 5 stages of the "Ignatian Pedagogical Paradigm" are:


- 1. Context
- 2. Experience
- 3. Reflection
- 4. Action
- 5. Evaluation.

Fr. Sunny mentioned the importance of these 5 stages by sharing his life experiences and put forth that, as an institute of Social Sciences, Loyola follows a curriculum that accommodates the communities around us. Along with this, he talked about the four preferences of the Society of Jesus, i.e.

- 1. Leading people to God
- 2. Walking with Excluded
- 3. Working with the Youth
- 4. Caring for common House.

He ended his talk by stressing the importance of value-based education and field engagements which helps in moulding a human being into a socially responsible person.

By 9:45 AM Dr.Francina P.X, Assistant Professor, MSW Department, engaged us in an action song "Making Melody in Your Heart, Enjoy Yourselves" to boost our spirit.



Around 9:50 AM, Jince Joseph from MSW Department invited the IQAC Coordinator and Assistant Professor Dr. Jasmine Sarah Alexander for IQAC Orientation. She stressed the importance of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). In 2001 NAAC Accreditation, Loyola College has received a maximum score of 5 stars and while on reaccreditation, Loyola managed to score A grade with CGPA 3.7/4 and 3.72/4 in the years 2007 and 2014 respectively.



Dr.Jasmine gave us an insight into the student participation in IQAC programmes and briefly described the 7 assessment criteria of NAAC-

- 1. Curricular Aspects
- 2. Teaching, Learning and Evaluation
- 3. Research Extension and Collaboration
- 4. Infrastructure and Learning Resources
- 5. Student Support and Progression
- 6. Governance and Leadership
- 7. Institutional Values and Best Practices.

She concluded her presentation by reminding the students of their duties such as active participation and contributions towards the common goal of attaining excellence.

Duration: 10:45 AM- 12:30 PM

The third session started at 10:45 AM on the topic 'Introduction to Outcome-Based Education' by Dr.Prakash Pillai, HOD Department of Personnel Management. The session was done to give insights about different approaches to the teaching and learning process through the new system of Outcome-Based Education (OBE). Fundamentals of OBE and how Loyola brings that into our curriculum were highlighted in this session.



He explained the prominence of how thinking and learning should be combined to attain knowledge that helps in our critical thinking. The contrast between traditional teaching and OBE was also described. He elucidated the four aspects of OBE and how these four aspects influence our academic learning. Then the session dealt with Bloom's Revised Taxonomy on six levels of knowledge transmission. The last part of the session expounded on hierarchy of outcomes, vision and mission, programme outcomes, programme specific outcomes and course outcomes. The session ended with an explanation about how these outcomes work at departmental and college levels. Everyone was later dispersed for a lunch break from 12:30 PM to 1:30 PM.

Duration: 1:30 PM - 4:30 PM

By 1:30 PM, Dr. Sonny Jose, HOD of MSW Department, delivered a talk on the topic "Self-Awareness". The session started by showing the students a picture of an elephant and explaining the fact that everyone will have different perspectives on the same thing.

Then Sir continued the discussion by explaining the objectives of the session. i.e:-

- 1. Attempt a self-assessment
- 2. Acknowledge the self-image
- 3. Challenging the self-assessment.



After explaining all the objectives of the program Dr.Sonny asked us to play a game called "Connecting the 9 Dots" where everyone drew 9 dots on their note and tried to connect it only by using only 4 lines. Few students were successful in the game and the rest were not. The game was meant for making

us confident enough to come out of our comfort zones and experience the adventures of the outer world. This game was followed by another icebreaking session where he asked us to write down "who we are?" and our "Qualities" to make us understand our real selves.

Through "Know Thy Self", Dr.Sonny lectured about Public, Blind, Hidden and Unknown areas. These areas are differentiated based on what we and other people around us know about our abilities and qualities. Dr.Sonny Jose wanted us to learn about ourselves by getting feedback from others. He also quoted that "People who are the best in the world are the people who know themselves better". Sir made us play the "Matchbox game" (Putting one Matchbox on top of one another until it topples). After the game we realized the fact that human beings tend to underestimate their actual abilities to do things in their lives.

Later on, Sir shared his life experience in Loyola where his transformation from a shy and insecure boy to a confident and independent man took place. He emphasized that no one cares about our failures and that; it is we who should lead our path to success by truthfully knowing ourselves.

The last session began with the Principal Dr.Saji.P.Jacob introducing the Chief guest Dr.Nadarajah Manickam, Consultant, The Multiversity Platform, LES who talked on the topic "Living a Violent, Broken World: Urgent Need to Rethink Education and Our Common Future" as part of the Golden Jubilee Memorial Lecture.



The Resource person started the session by saying that this topic is very important for us so that we can know, understand and react in the right manner towards nature. Dr.Nadarajah Manickam showed a few screen presentations. The first video showed Polar Bears falling from the sky and said that an average airplane ride of a person causes damages equal to the weight of fully grown polar bear. The second video was about the meat distribution method and the cruelty that happens in industrial farming, he also addressed the issue of obesity among adults and youth. The third video was about how men exploited the nature.


Then Dr.Nadarajah Manickam showed us few pictures and told us about the cruel reality of Mother Earth today. Those pictures were images of dead rhino, deforestation, terrorism, inter-ethnic conflict, Vietnam War, skinning zebra, polluted water, cut off animal heads, genocide, trapped sea turtles and migration refugees. He also mentioned that 900 animal species were gone extinct in the past 500 years. He quoted the words of Dr.Haim Ginott:-

"I am a survivor of concentration camp. My eyes saw what no person should witness: gas chambers built by learned engineers. Children poisoned by educated by physicians. Infants killed by trained nurses. Woman and babies shot by high school and College graduates. So, I am suspicious of education. My request is: help your children become human. Your efforts must never produce learned monsters or skilled psychopaths. Reading, writing and arithmetic are important only if they serve to make our children more human"

He also reminded us that we have only 12 years to limit climate change catastrophe which was said by the UN in 2018. Climate change and rising sea levels in Bombay, Calcutta and Alappuzha is also a concern. He showed the World Hunger Statistics, that is, 821 million people go to bed hungry every day; 1.5 million children die every year due to severe malnutrition; approximately 462 million adults are underweight worldwide.

He mentioned Global Economic Inequality, that is, US billionaires gained 1 trillion since the Pandemic Started. His main question was what is the use of education if it can't provide the society with what it needs? Finally he asked us to Re-focus, Re-claim and Go back to basics to keep our home alive. The session was very enlightening and eye-opening. The session ended at 4:30 PM with Fr.Dr.Sabu.P.Thomas delivering the vote of thanks.



After the tea-break, by 4:30 PM, students were permitted to share their experience and evaluation of the Induction day 2. They gave their opinions and suggestions to the faculty. The faculty members answered all their queries and replied to every suggestion positively. Thus the second day of the Induction programme ended with a fruitful experience.

DAY-3 (December 8, 2021)

The third day of the Induction Programme 2021-'23 was on 8th December 2021 and the venue was Sutter Hall, Loyola College of Social Sciences. The initial session started around 9 am with a prayer. The prayer was followed by a session on OBE & Loyola Campus Activities presented by Andrew Michaels, Assistant Professor, Department of Sociology.

The speaker emphasized the importance of education on a value oriented aspect which he mentioned as a "step out and stand out mechanism" rather than purely involved in academics. He stated his perspectives on moulding one's character based on education. He mentioned the motto of Jesuit education, which encourages human values. He appreciated the curricular and co curricular activities of Loyolaties who served the community during calamities. He stated that education should enable oneself to be active in everything thereby fostering excellence in thinking, commitment and engagement. Based on Loyola activities different clubs, associations, colloquiums, theatre and extension service sectors were introduced among students. He narrated the struggle of a seedling to grow as a tree as it goes through many painful stages to reach its maturity. Similarly, human beings are moulded by his exposure and experiences. So we must stand out for the well being of the society and step out of our comfort zones for holistic and sustainable development.



The next session was conducted by Dr. Jyothy Krishnan. Her topic of discussion was engaged competence and enhancement. In this session, she mainly focused on global competence and social engagement. She inspired us with three different stories about women social activists.

The first story was of Aruna Roy, a civil servant who quit her job to understand the rural reality. She led a movement called Mazdoor Kisan Shakti Sangathan, which gave the right to work and the right to information to the farmers. It also led away from the village to parliament which led to the passing of two legislations; 1) MGNREGA 2005, 2) Right to Information Act.

The second story was about Medha Patkar, a social activist who led the movement, Narmada Bachao Andolan, an MSW graduate from Tata Institute of Social Sciences. For this movement, she held meetings, 'dharna' and struggles with innovative strategies which captured global attention.

She also gave us the connection of these stories and between competence and social engagements. Finally, she also gave the last story of an activist, Greta Thunberg, an environmental activist. She led her movement of school strike for climate. She came up with extraordinary competence. Then Fr. Ranjith I George gave a brief introduction and he invited Mr. Girish, an alumnus who greeted every student. Also, he gave an important remark on our college i.e

"One golden opportunity is that the college provides you with opportunities to everyone."



After the tea break the session started at 11am. The session was handled by Fr. Ranjith I George. He introduced the alumni's and the members in charge of LES (Loyola Extension Services). The guests on the dice were Ms. Anandavalli, Mr. Baby, Ms. Pushpa Bhai, Mr. Girish, etc. Fr. Renjith explained about the activities and objectives of Loyola Extension Services, followed by Mr. Baby who spoke about Social Entrepreneur Startup Village. He was an alumnus of Loyola College. He also introduced Blue Point organization, with branches in Thiruvananthapuram, Kochi, and Bangalore. The Principal of Loyola College, Thiruvananthapuram signed an agreement between the organisation and Loyola.



The next session was an entry-level self-assessment. In the session, Ms. Jesline Maria M. Mamen, Dr. Ammu Lukose and Ms. Nikki Veronca, faculty members of Counselling Psychology provided three questionnaires for a personal assessment. The students were requested to answer the questionnaire genuinely. This session was meant for self-evaluation.

The chief attraction of the third-day induction program was undoubtedly the public speaking training and workshop that we had in the afternoon. Our mentor, Mr. Jobi Kondoor, through various group tasks, brought us out of our various comfort zones and helped us interact well. All the activities were oriented towards overcoming the fears involved in public speaking.

The practical tips were coupled with theoretical inputs on how to deliver a good speech. After this session, at around 2.30 PM, the whole group was further divided into subgroups and was sent to different corners under the guidance of various teachers. For the next one hour, we were in the lab of the oratory. Each group consisted of seven members and all were given five minutes to choose a topic and prepare to deliver a speech of 5 minutes. This group exercise helped all the freshers of Loyola College to deliver a speech in public. The teachers assigned for each group helped the students through their timely interventions and corrections. Later, during the evaluation

session, almost all of us shared that this group exercise was indeed helpful in stepping out of all the phobias. Another unique feature of this workshop was the selection of topics. The teachers expressed their surprise at the students' expertise over the topics that

they chose.



The evaluation session that followed the tea break was memorable as we could see new faces coming forward boldly with their own observations and suggestions, thanks to the public speaking workshop. Four students from each group stepped forward to share their observations. The observations



shared by the students gave an impression that the third day of induction was very much fruitful. After the turn of students, the teachers expressed their views and reflections on the programs of the day. After this the induction program of the third day was formally dispersed. Although we were free to go homes, students continued to be in their groups preparing for the creative presentation on Friday.

Day 4 (December 9, 2021)

SESSION 1:

The fourth day of the Induction Programme was conducted on 09th December 2021 at Sutter Hall, Loyola College of Social Sciences. The morning session commenced at 9 am with the prayer song, by the Programme Committee (Group 2). Followed by that, Group 1 presented the previous day's (Day 3) Induction Programme report. They presented a brief report with the support of two videos. Each group has presented a creative team presentation. There were fifteen minutes for each team's presentation. The performance of each team was amazing. The entire faculty appreciated their presentation.




Time of Evaluation: 11.45 a.m. - 12.30 p.m.

<u>DAY 1</u>

The induction program for "2021-2013 batch of Loyola College of Social Sciences" started on 5th January 2021 at 9:00am at Sutter hall with a secular New Year prayer.
