RESEARCH COLLOQUIUM

1. The context that required the initiation of the practice

In order to raise the bar of quality of our student dissertations, Loyola College of Social Sciences came up with a proactive mechanism titled “Research colloquium”. Under this programme, our final semester students go through three phases of presentations of their research work at various stages of their dissertation. The presentations are made before an inter-disciplinary expert panel of 3-4 teachers and an audience comprising of research scholars, other dissertation students and junior students. The feedback and the corrective measures gathered from these presentations ensure that each and every dissertation submitted by a Loyolite possesses optimum standard. This practice is in addition to the personal guidance provided by the faculty guide throughout the course of dissertation.

2. Objectives of the practice

The overall goal of the Research colloquium is to ensure that the dissertations submitted by our students possess superior quality. The research Clinic also serves, in the process, to accomplish the following sub-objectives:

- To ensure the students have an effective and logical understanding of the research methodology.
- To monitor the proper and timely completion of research dissertations.
- To solicit multiple views and expert opinion on a particular research topic.
- To act as a platform for exchange of information on research methodology.
- To induct junior students into the process of research.
- To facilitate contribution to the existing literature in their research areas.
- To inculcate the love for the process of research in the minds of students.

3. The Practice

The faculty-in-charge of the research centre is responsible for conducting the research colloquium. Under the Research clinic, every student is required to go through three stages of presentations. The first presentation happens right at the beginning phase when the researcher has finalized his research topic and the methodology he/she wants to adopt. This presentation sets the tone for the entire research as the basic framework and the research methodology adopted is discussed in depth here. The second presentation happens just before they enter the data collection phase. The progress up to that point is presented and the suggestions for the corrective steps to be administered are provided. The last presentation is conducted once the students have completed their analysis and findings part. This is the most important presentation as the student is required to provide a complete picture of their thesis. While the first and the third presentation happen at the college level, the second presentation happens at the departmental level. Some departments have more than one presentation in which external experts are invited to provide feedback.

The presentations take place before a 3-4 member expert panel of teachers drawn from all departments. The feedback received from the expert panel which is interdisciplinary in nature ensures that various perspectives are addressed. The teachers in the panel are given a feedback form in which they have to provide their written feedback about each presentation, in addition to verbal feedback. This feedback form about each student’s presentation is then forwarded to the respective guides, who are to discuss the issues with the student.

The audience for the research colloquium includes fellow presenters, junior students and research scholars, who chip in with suggestions and doubts. This exercise acts as a strong platform for a student to sharpen the understanding

research methodology, defend their presentation and clarify the doubts and concerns raised by the audience. It also gives the students an exposure to the various nuances of research. Fine tuning of the thesis happens during these presentations and the student gains confidence and pride in their research work.

4. Impact of the practice

This practice has been instrumental in raising the standard of the dissertations of final year students. It is also a platform for knowledge sharing and deliberation where both teachers and students gain more information on research. The research clinic acts as a detailed induction for the juniors to the field of research. While earlier dissertations were only an academic requirement, introduction of research clinics have made the dissertation a very serious affair. As students are exposed to multiple dissertations and different views, they understand the importance and complexity of research. The research clinic is grand endeavor that brings together every single student, researcher scholar and faculty of the college to focus on research.

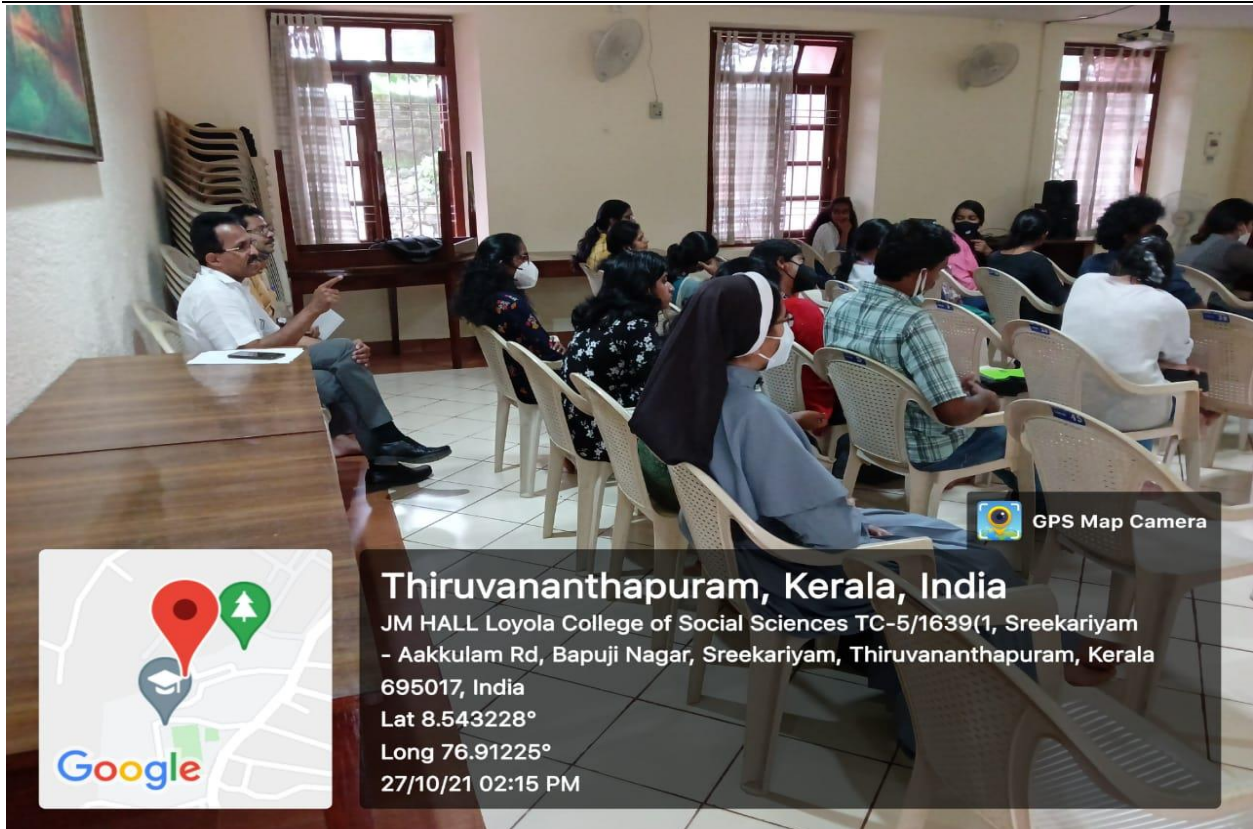

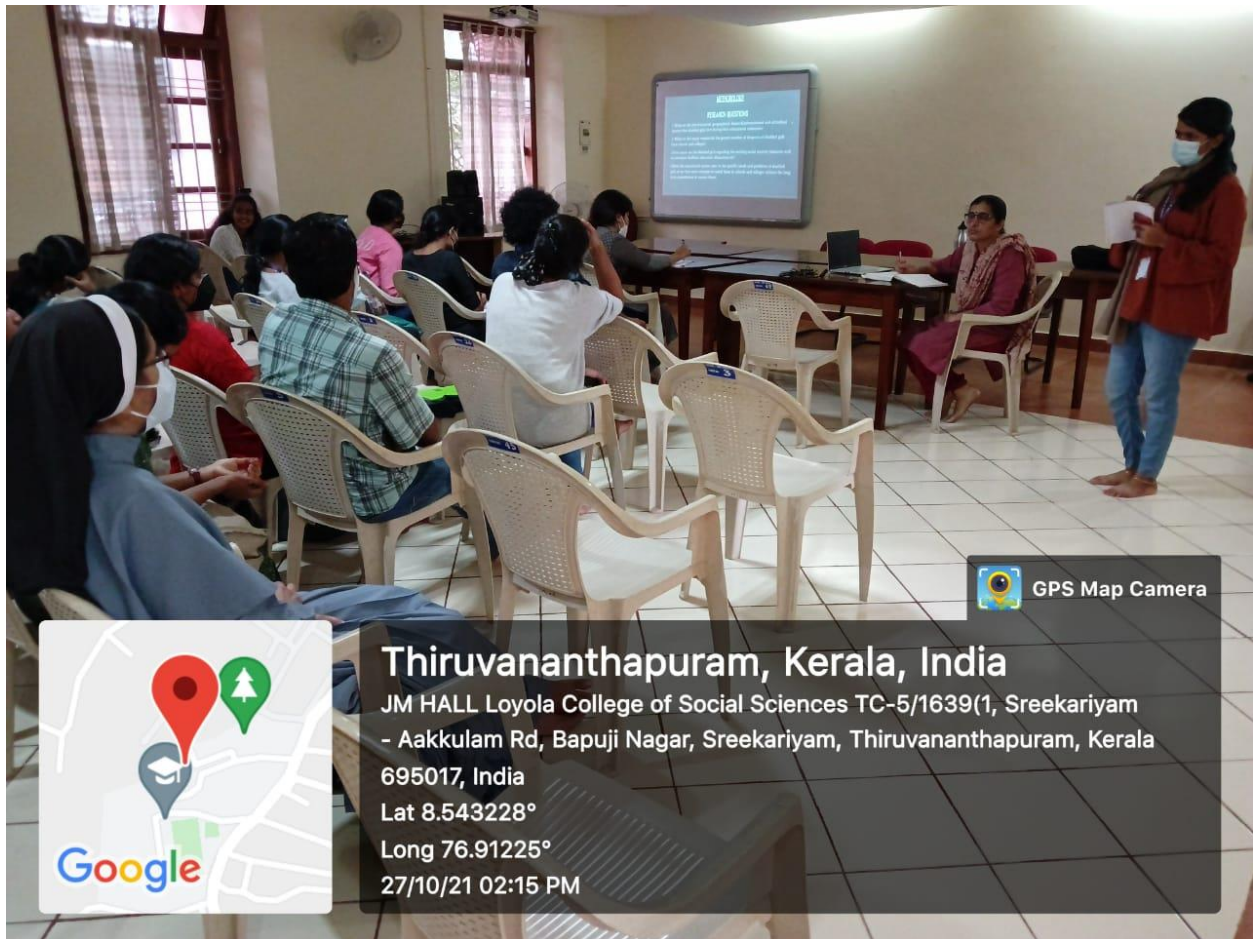

'Research Colloquium' is one of the Best practices followed in Loyola College of Social Sciences. The main aim of this programme is to improve the quality of our student dissertations. Under this programme, our final semester students go through 2 phases of presentations of their research work at various stages of their dissertation. The first presentation happens right at the initial stage of their project when the researcher has finalized his/her research topic and the methodology he/she wants to adopt. This presentation helps the researcher to create a basic framework for his project and also the research methodology adopted is discussed in depth here. The last presentation is conducted once the students have completed their analysis and findings part. This is the most important stage of the presentation where the student is required to provide a complete picture of their dissertation. Usually student presentations are made at department level and after that a college level presentations are done. The college level presentations are done before an inter-disciplinary expert panel of 3-4 teachers and an audience comprising of research scholars, other dissertation students and junior students. Inter department level presentation helps the students to get insights on different topics from other disciplines. After each presentation a constructive feedbacks and comments will be providing to the researchers based on their presentations. The feedback and the corrective measures gathered from these presentations ensure that each and every dissertation submitted by a student of Loyola possesses optimum standard.

Loyola College of Social Sciences has adopted this best practice for a long time and it's still being practiced. On the onset of the Pandemic COVID-19 entire educational system of the college got transferred to online platform. In this scenario the dissertation presentation for the outgoing students were conducted through online. As it was through online, considering the technical issues, college level presentation was not conducted for the outgoing batch. The two phases of the presentation was able to conduct only at department level. The first stage of the presentation was the draft presentation and it was conducted on 22nd October 2020 at the respective department through online. Here each students were allotted 15 minutes for presenting their project followed by discussion. The presentation covered the following areas:

Significance of the study

Brief Literature Review

Objectives/Research Questions

Hypotheses / Assumptions (if any)

Major Variables

Research design and Methodology

The Researchers stated their research problem in detail followed by its significance and other procedural methods. The faculties and the research scholars in the department provided their comments on the student presentation and also highlighted the drawbacks in the methodology section. The draft presentation was conducted in two days by each department. The whole session helped the researchers to frame an idea about what they have to do.

The second phase of the presentation was conducted on 2nd April 2021 through online. It was also conducted only at department level. The presentation covered the following areas:

Research design and Methodology

Analysis and Interpretation

Findings and Conclusion

Suggestions

This is the last and important part of the presentation, where the students are in a stage of completing their findings and analysis part and thereby providing a complete picture of the dissertation. Constructive comments were provided by the expert panel which helped the researchers to make changes in their projects before their final submission.

It is also a platform for knowledge sharing and deliberation where both teachers and students gain more information on research. The college level draft presentation of dissertation was on Nov 13 & 14 2019. Each students were allotted 15 minutes for presenting their project followed by discussion. The presentation covered the following areas:

- Significance of the study
- Brief Literature Review
- Objectives/Research Questions
- Hypotheses / Assumptions (if any)
- Major Variables
- Research design and Methodology
- Analysis and Interpretation
- Findings and Conclusion
- Suggestions

On 3rd and 4th June 2020, our final semester students went through the various phases of presentations of their research work. The presentations were made before an inter-disciplinary expert panel of 3-4 teachers and an audience comprising of research scholars, other dissertation students and junior students. Each students were allotted 15 minutes to explain their research problem highlighting the -Significance of the study, literature gap, objectives, research questions, research design and methodology etc. The presentation sets a tone for the entire research as the basic framework and the research methodology adopted is discussed in an in-depth manner. After the presentations there was a feedback session. Scholars and teachers from other departments discuss respective research problems and suggest changes to be made. Students were asked to elaborate more on Statement of the problem and methodology chapters. The teachers in the panel were given a feedback form in which they have to provide their written feedback about each presentation, in addition to

verbal feedback. This feedback form about each student's presentation is then forwarded to the respective guides, who are to discuss the issues with the student. The feedback and the corrective measures gathered from these presentations ensure that each and every dissertation submitted by a Loyolite possesses optimum standard. This practice is in addition to the personal guidance provided by the faculty guide throughout the course of dissertation.

This practice has been instrumental in raising the standard of the dissertations of final year students. It is also a platform for knowledge sharing and deliberation where both teachers and students gain more information on research. This process also acts as a detailed induction for the juniors to the field of research.
