IQAC Symposium on NAAC Accreditation Process: Lessons learnt from 4 recently accredited AIT colleges in Kerala.

9 to 5.30 pm

The symposium started sharp at 9 a.m. The IQAC coordinator was the MC of the program. Prayer song was rendered by Dr. Nisha Jolly Nelson, HOD of Sociology Dept, following which Dr. Saji A Jacob, Principal, gave the welcome. Fr. Sunay Kunnappallil offered the Presidential Address. Following which, Prof. Dr. Rajan Gururukab delivered the Inaugural address. He talked about IT-enabled teaching-learning and its pros and cons. He urged teachers to become mavericks who can use IT tools to make online tools more meaningful to students. Fr. Sabu P. Thomas, Vice-Principal offered the Vote of Thanks.

Dr. Jasmine presented the NAAC message by the NAAC Director, ~~After~~ and gave common instructions to the participants.

There in The first session began at 9.55 am. Dr. Mary Venus Joseph, IQAC Coordinator, gave the presented Rajagiri's accreditation journey. Dr. Binoy Joseph joined her when she began the Question-Answer Session at 10.50-11 am. The Session broke for tea-break at 11.15 am upto 11.30 am. Dr. Sonay Kuriakose, ~~Sir~~ of Nirmala College made the second presentation. The lunch break began at 1-2 pm and started at 2 pm. Dr. Kala of St. Teresa's started their presentation at 2 pm and went upto 3.20 pm. After tea-break Dr. Sunil C. Mathew from St. Thomas college started his presentation. Programme concluded at 5.30 pm.

Interaction Questions asked and Main points discussed:

- Session 1:
- 1) ~~NAAC~~ Pre-visit mock visits - Rajagiri conducted 4

 - 3) All stakeholders need to be well aware of the process.

- 8) Role of Infrastructure - Maintaining the infrastructure and utilizing the infrastructure - Campus Infrastructure Maintenance Committee (chat box question)
- 9) Benchmarks for 5th cycle - check colleges who went for 5th cycle on NAAC website (chat)
- 10) Criteria 7 - How to select 2 best practices - They Rajagiri selected 2 best practice - 1 internal and 1 external - one what happens inside the college & 2nd what is done for the society. NAAC finalizes the best practice. 4 steps - identification, implementation, institutionalization, internalization & dissemination. Something that is relevant to other institutions. (Sneha)
- 11) Institutional distinctiveness \rightarrow related to the vision and mission and ^{based on} other reviews from other stakeholders - Rajagiri immersive learning. They will cross-check with stakeholders. (Chynette)
- 12) How did you handle student satisfaction survey? If students don't claim that SSR claims don't exist, then the process is defeated. Rajagiri addressed in batches. So we need to have awareness programmes for students. Motivate students asking them benefits of studying in a top ranked college.
- 13) Academic Audit & feedback system (Neenu) - Curricular aspects - Revision through BOS, Student Appraisal. Academic Audit - Annually. Administrative & Academic Audit need not be separated - it happens together. There is a format. Report - Suggestions discussed in common platform.
- 14) Quality Audits on Environment & Energy - Agencies do the audit with participation of students.
- 15) How far peer team cross-verified SSR & AQAR - NAAC Verifier. It. AQAR is more important than previous times.

SESSION 2 – DR. SONY KURIAKOSE

1. **Question:** you were saying something about the IQAC intervention with respect to the various program that is being conducted by the various departments as well as the various outreach agencies like NSS, NCC and may be other social outreach programs conducted by the departments. When we document it we should have something like a circular or something as part of the documentation or our mention with respect to the report is enough?

Response: I believe that your college prepares IQAC action plan at the beginning of the year, so before preparing the IQAC action plan, we should hold a meeting with the NSS coordinator and NCC coordinator, and at least we have a minutes of that meeting, IQAC department interface meeting, IQAC clubs interface meetings, and show a box of minutes in the meetings, the recommendations of IQAC, so they wanted to know the intervention of the IQAC for some colleges, number of quality initiatives of IQAC, you can see the number say 120 or 130 that is a huge number. During the assessment period the number of activities initiated by the IQAC, that is not convincing, when you claim a number that should be convincing, so the issue is that IQAC will claim all those things if NSS program conducts an extension program IQAC is there. In all brochures we can see IQAC. That is the issue. If you conduct an FDP program so that is an IQAC program. If you collaborate it with the department no issues.

2. **Question:** In St. Albert's college we have a separate department called Dean for Training and Development, it is an agency in which we conducting so many programs for the teachers, students training and we have also the outreach. Can we include all those things, which means these directly comes under the IQAC?

Response: Definitely you can include, because the establishments of the training division is based on the recommendation of the IQAC. IQAC also gives suggestions to the training departments, for example this year we should give more focus on the programs on how to engage students in online learning. Based on the suggestion they can organize programs accordingly.

3. **Question:** you were mentioning that we need to collect the latest affiliation in the certificate. Are you talking about the course affiliation or the college affiliation because college affiliation for affiliated colleges you get only one certificate. Only for self financing colleges every year it is reissued. So can you clarify on that sir?

Response: Affiliation letter in the sense that University will give a letter showing all the programs, for example for the aided program they will write in bracket permanent and for self financing program they write one year temporary. It's only that thing.

4. **Question:** In Kerala University I think there is no such practices of issuing this every year. So I will verify with the university once again. I think there are some differences from university to university as you belong to MG university. So the practice could be a little different over there. I don't know any way I will have to verify it.

Response: I know at least five colleges when they submit IIQA the NAAC asked to submit the latest affiliation.

5. **Question:** you have mentioned that in affiliated colleges, teaching learning are more important. And the curriculum activities are important than the research activities. But we face a practical difficulty when we go for this accreditation courses the peer team members asked for the publication details and all they were not care about the extension activities and the community related works. Any way my question is different most of these courses are as we are affiliated to one of the university the courses are and all the courses are designed by the university and we are just teaching this courses. So how we can actually improve that area like adding more courses or something like that. Can you explain it in detail?

Response: So regarding the first part of your question, I clearly mentioned that extension and innovation activities are more important from the point of view of the quantitative parameters not the qualitative parameters. If you see the weightage that the research is less important. When peer team comes, that will become an issue. They ask for the citation. So from the quantitative point of view, I'm not saying that it is not important. It is important, but extension is more important for an affiliated college especially for a PG college. For UG college extension is more important but when we come to autonomous college and this universities this importance of extension comes down. So that is the thing. I suggest one more thing. We analyze our case St. Theresa's or St. Thomas or Rajagiri, you see their numbers on research, you can see that not that good still they get marks. The second thing is regarding the curriculum, here NAAC is not focusing on the curriculum design. They only focuses on the curriculum delivery part. So if you do not have proper documentation. For example in the planning process the very first thing is university academic calendar will be there. The IQAC must have academic calendar which is prepared in consultation with the examination committee and various work log committee and the Principal and teachers. IQAC also have to collect the departmental academic plans, so when IQAC combines the University academic calendar and the various departments academic plans, the college creates the academic calendar of the college. So this is the process. If you have proper documentation for that, that part is over. And that is regarding the curriculum delivery process. In the delivery process, we can do a blended approach rather than a traditional method of learning. So we need to continue that to the peer team members. And if you select open courses, in Kerala colleges are having open courses, when you select open courses, you can select courses the things related to environment, which are related to human rights, so if you curriculum doesn't have that kind of programs you can choose open courses like that. And under that you can add value added courses. In the latest manual the value added courses are not there. But definitely you should offer value added courses. And when you offer certificate program you should ensure that there should not be any overlapping in the syllabus. I'm from a commerce background, I'm a teacher in commerce and finance, we

have a course called GST. If our department offers a certificate program in GST that do not be counted. If you offer a certificate program on the practical of GST that really counts. When we plan our curriculum we should do like that.

6. **Question:** what consultancy and corporate trainings are in criteria 3. What are the activities?

Response: Regarding consultancy our college is also not good. Because for our matrix, I belong to an affiliated college we don't have that matrix and all that. So I'm not the right person to comment on it. May be Binoy sir will be adding. If he is available.

7. **Question:** you had already mentioned that GST is our program. Suppose we offer value added course with MoU based collaboration with tax study center, we offer the course on practical accounting, tally and GST. Is it countable?

8. **Response:** Is it a value-added course or certificate course? If it is certificate course they will see the syllabus of your certificate course and syllabus you have to upload in criteria 2. So if they find any matching, that would become a problem, certificate courses are meant for curriculum enrichment, to offer the same things which are already included in the curriculum will not be counted.

9. **Question:** But in certificate course we are offering practical classes.

10. **Response:** Then that will not be a problem.

11. **Question:** clarity of the MHRM you mentioned about, whether the course is renamed or what is the status?

Response: Still it is MHRM because, the university has to change that thing, so in fact I was in another college under the same management, we have got two colleges Newman college Thodupuzha and Nirmala college, I got transferred to Nirmala college in 2019 only, so within six months we could submit the IIQA I think in the month of December 2019. So before Rajagiri submitted their IIQA and we submitted our SSR and IIQA. So that time when we submitted our IIQA this problem came, the MHRM issue, then I try to contact the NAAC director, and the NAAC coordinator in the NAAC office, so he said you contact the UGC office, so I try to contact UGC office there was no gain, I went to university personally, the Principal and the manager personally went to the university there was no use. And we could convince the NAAC official regarding this. So because it is not our problem, it is the problem of University. The university has to rename the program and they said there was one option in the portal, MHM master of Hospitality Management so there is a flip on it. So we did like it. Otherwise it is impossible.

12. **Question:** guides who are outside, who are not internal faculty members listed in the college. can we add the outside faculties, who are not in the college?

Response: No, we cannot add

13. **Question:** Even if they are recognized research guides in our centre it cannot be added in our centre right? And how about their students then?

Response: Because that matrix is not there, the number of students is not there. We should add the number of research scholars to the number of students.

14. **Question:** ACCA program of our college by external provider, can we show that?

Response: Definitely it is a curriculum enrichment program, because the program will definitely help the students, they have an MoU definitely they have in criteria 3.

15. **Question:** there are multiple questions on the difference between add on course, certificate course and value added course. Can you please explain?

Response: According to my knowledge, I think UGC started so many add on program in 2005 or 2006 like that. That time I was not in service, that time UGC started add on course. I think in 2010 after that UGC stopped funding for that, add on courses. But some of the colleges are still running, those colleges in self financing colleges, no UGC assistance is there, so those programs are there. Some colleges are starting certificate courses, I think there is no significantly difference. Add on courses can be diploma program, certificate program or PG Diploma, those versions are there. But for those program the UGC letter should be with us and done more thing if you start a certificate course, it should be properly documented in your department minutes, that is very important. It should be based on some kinds of, teachers will said, we started this certificate program in 2018, so there should be rationale for starting a certificate program. Whether students said, we don't have much practical exposure in our curriculum, or the parents or employees say, there should be some rationale and we should communicate that thing to the governing body also. The governing body can give necessary guidance regarding that. IQAC should also have a curriculum feedback on it. A three member or four member committee. You can include a statistician in the committee for analyzing the responses of the various stake holders, the IQAC feedback committee can give suggestions to the departments, so based on the departments can think of a certificate course. Now the colleges are starting six or seven certificate courses every year. So that won't be good.

16. **Question:** NPTEL certification, how about that? Can we count on the certifications?

Response: NPTEL certification, I don't think that will be counted. The certificate programs offered by the college will be counted. Certificate programs offered by the, but if the students are doing lots of online programs. That you can include when you draft the qualitative processing criteria 2. For example in our college, the course ray rating for Nirmala college is 4.7 out of 5. So that is really an achievement of the college. Then we write the teaching and learning I think in a qualitative portions you can include that.

17. **Question:** if we fail to give the IIQA within the valid period so what is the procedure then?

Response: Now the NAAC is given one month extension period because of the Covid pandemic. When the normalcy is announced by the university and the government. So they should give IIQA within three months. Otherwise their validity will be intruded. I know some of the colleges. I don't want to name those colleges. Because of this Covid issue they couldn't complete the assessment procedure. So because of that they didn't get foreign students this year. In order to get foreign student we need to have a score of 3.36. I think it is 3.26. So their validity ended in 2020. Because of the Covid issues they have submitted the IIQA, submitted the SSR, they have done all those things. It is not the

mistake done by the college, but they didn't get the students from UGC I mean the foreign students. When the normalcy is announced if your accreditation is pending, we should submit it within three months time. Otherwise their validity will be lost. One more thing I wanted tell, now it is lot of online courses, blended learning courses, how come up and for colleges which will be submitting SSR will be in next two years. That wouldn't be a problem but the issue is NAAC is formulating other guidelines for blended learning programs and online programs, so there will be changes in the manual. So I think the two communities are formed before that and they are discussing of program. That is what I understand.

18. **Question:** something related to certificate program here Loyola College we have a extension of continue education, centre for development and continue education. Two programs we are running so can we count on it?

Response: Definitely, that is part of your college.

19. **Question:** Do we have to have a new certificate programs every year if we want new programs, or shall we continue with the same?

Response: The issue is NAAC counts only the new programs introduced. Not the total number of programs. If you can modify syllabus and introduce a new certificate course after 2 years that will be nice. So every year new certificate course that couldn't be done.

20. **Question:** my question is based on the statement you mention, that is you need not mention the activity repeatedly under two different criteria. If a group of students have conducted an extension program in the field of environment this activity can come under criteria 3 as well as under criteria 7. So how do you not mention in both the places?

Response: The thing is I said this with regard to the quantitative thing not the qualitative thing, if the students have done the program on environment definitely you can include it in criteria 3. And the same time it can be included in the qualitative matrix in criteria 7, not in quantitative matrix because you got marks for that particular program in other criteria. How can NAAC gives marks for the same program under two criteria. So that will be rejected so if you the DVV the most of the rejection will happen in criteria 7. That is mainly because of the repetition.

21. **Question:** if you submitted the IIQA within last six months of the validity period can we go beyond validity period before the submission of SSR?

Response: NAAC says we should submit, I think we should start the preparation of IIQA before six months of the SSR submission. I mean the expected date. IIQA, I don't think they will give more time. Because when you submit IIQA, after that you get 45 days.

22. **Question:** suppose November 30 is my deadline, I submit IIQA on first November.

Response: No issues, that 45 days NAAC can give extension.

23. **Question:** we normally add a guest faculties who completed nine months in the institution, if we increase the number will it affect some other criteria like exact publication per teacher and all?

Response: Some matrix increase the number of the matrixes that help you. For example student teacher ratio, mentor mentai ratio, more number of teachers will help but, if you give a trade of there are more matrix in harm the college.

24. **Question:** which are the matrixes omitted by your college? Do you have any general suggestions?

Response: I think the new manual omit anything. I think so I don't know, in our case, we submitted our SSR 2020 February. In 2020 January new manual came. We were knowing that the new manual will come. We were submitted the IIQA in December itself so we can submit the SSR in the older format. So many people said new format is simple but I don't think so the earlier format was more flexible because the optional matrix was there. There are so many benefits in the old. If you see the data templates also, the new data templates are very complicated. If you give any wrong data they can easily detect. Earlier it was not there. For example one college, I think the number of scholarship given to the students that was the matrix, assessment focus on the number not the amount. So they gave Rs 100 to all those students who got A+. so the number got increased, so there are good marks also. Now it is corrected in the DVV manual. So those things are there in the old manual. Do you the student teacher ratio, I think the UGC suggested the ratio of 25 or 30. 25:1 or 30:1. And if you have a student teacher ratio of 15:1 is one is okay, but you didn't get a good mark for that.

SESSION 3 - DR. KALA M S

1. **Question:** My question is energy initiatives taken by your department, I mean, by your college I'm representing physics department in my college. So can you say something more about the energy initiatives, whether it is funded by the government or from the management?

Response: I'm very happy to answer this question, I'm belonging to the physics department too. So the energy initiatives are under the banner of I connect, energy initiatives of Therasians for the conservation of energy and nature. so it actually started with Oorjakiran, you might have heard of Oorjakiran a project by Kerala Government, so we are the participating agency of this Oorjakiran. So our students have got a chance to attend an LED assembling workshop under this Oorjakiran project. So this was actually the seed which we started all our energy related activities. So our students started assembling LED bulbs. The raw materials could be purchased by the shops nearby. When we understood that we can do a lot of things in this area so we consulted with people who are working in this area. So our first project was the popularization of these types of LED bulbs in alternate energy resources. So we conducted a series of workshop, seminars etc in nearby schools, colleges. we imparted training on LED assembling to Kudumbasree members etc. then one of our notable achievement as I mentioned in the presentation, our students they distributed 500 self assembled LED bulbs to the flood affected areas of the Pizhala that is an Island in Ernakulam district. So that was supported by. So we submitted the project to many agencies and state bank of India provided us support for this project that was called Ray of Hope. Further we proceeded to conduct an energy audit of the

college, so in the last session also I saw that so many colleges were asking about the energy environment merits. So you must understand that many government accredited energy auditors are around so you can seek the help of them. We sought the help of one such accredited energy auditor with his help and including the i-connect members with our students we conduct a pre energy audit in the college that is they surveyed lights fans etc. and after that an actual audit was conducted by the team, so they will give us recommendations regarding we have to replace all the old incandescent bulbs, tube lights etc. since our students were doing this LED bulb so we could do them very effortlessly. Campus was made filament free during the assessment period that too came from the initiative of our students. So I hope this is what you want to know, and of course won several awards for our energy conservation activities. One national award and two state awards.

2. **Question:** I would like to ask about the consultancy and corporate training ma'am, what type of activity is that? Can you explain?

Response: So we have consultancy policy first of all, and even I can ask for consultancy policy, so we have made a policy which is published in our website. So any teacher who takes up consultancy services has to pay, certain amount of that is certain percentage to the college, that depends on how much involvement is there for the teacher and how much for the institution. If it is using the research facilities, for example I'm physics department, people do come from outside to do measurements etc. So basically they use college facilities, so we offer consultancy services for that. So because like our 40 to 60 percent division for that. Regarding corporate training, individual teachers take up corporate trainings. For example we have food science department. So many people in the hotel industry food industry etc do come up and they give training on food quality food packaging. We have BVOC food processing in our department. Then the NSS unit NCC unit or all of them take up corporate training. We had a training for the police officers offered by the psychology and the English Department. So individual teachers take up corporate training.

3. **Question:** you were mentioned about the facilities made to women and elder people so how you make it possible? How you select the elder people? I would like to hear that.

Response: So you are talking about our project named Vayovigyan. Vayovigyan as the name suggests, which is a project for elderly people. So it is the department of Computer Application of our college it's their project actually. So they device this project to give training. Many elderly people not very adaptive in using computers and sending mails etc. so they devised a syllabus and the same is advertised in news papers and mouth to mouth publicity. So many many elderly people came forward and it was a three months program so in that basic training, many even though not know how to use Laptops, how to talk with children and relatives abroad etc. all such basic things sending mails etc. so that was a syllabus which could be completed in three months. So it was a three months certificate course. So basically mouth to mouth publicity one batch of people came in.

and from them other people came to know. And we had it sort of conducted in five or six batches.

Sheelu: Is the students or teachers taking classes. In each batch there is a specific number of people. Timing of the course, because students also have classes?

The students are taking classes. Depending on the computer we have to restrict the entry of the number of people. In our college after the regular class hours we have something called a zero hour. So after five regular working hours we have a zero hour in which all such activities are taken up so the computer science department students do this project during the zero hour.

4. **Question:** Can you clarify student exchange faculty exchange program?

Response: After the first cycle I know that to improve our exchange program, international collaborations. That was one of the suggestions in the third cycle of NAAC. We have setup a special unit called Theresian International and we have appointed a faculty for that also. So their job is to look for projects or write projects and bringing collaborations with international agencies and other universities. So as of now, as I have shown in this slide we have many collaborations in which our students are able to go abroad for a period of two weeks or so and attend the class there. So since we are still affiliated even though we are autonomous we are affiliated to the university so we cannot make a twinning program as much as we wanted, we cannot work for a twinning program at present. So we allow students to go to these Universities for example, our student's visits the Richmond University UK and spent one month over there. Then students from abroad also visits our campus it encourage researchers like full bright scholars etc to our campus. The careers in International a special Union set up for this and coordinate.

5. **Question:** I would like to know about the ERP system using in St. Theresa's college. What are the functions, or are you collected the feedback from stakeholders using this ERP system and the teaching evaluation process all that the how you are using this ERP system?

Response: So our ERP system is called DIGNA, so from this everything starting from admission to finally viewing the mark list and printing the mark list and give TC. All these are incorporated into our ERP system. From last year only we have to resort to the online mode of admission so our ERP system has been made adaptive for that also. Every hour we make our attendance entry through this portal and finally collated and came into the A form. I don't know what is the term you used for internal mark entry, that is the A form we have. So that attendance the teachers have to enter the attendance after every hour so that will be collected and given back to us in the internal form which is the attendance is a component. Then the internal mark entry all the things made through our ERP system. And of course the external examination marks are also enter through this, and finally all the marks will be combined in the final mark list obtained from this and then you asked about the feedback. Yes, the feedback is also from this year onwards, we have made the feedback compulsory that is the only if the student has done the feedback

she can register for the examination, because otherwise very few will do it, I mean they don't care to give the feedback even if we repeatedly ask. So this year we have made it compulsory along with this registration process. If the students are not done it they cannot go to the exam registration so that is feedback is also made online using this.

6. **Question:** Are you collecting documents also using this ERP system?

Response: No, not at the moment. But we are planning to, I mean we are not collecting documents from them, we have a system from IQAC every month we are collecting data from the departments. The document collection is not connected with the ERP at the moment.

7. **Question:** what did you think the challenges are? You could have scored better and where would you focus on?

Response: I think I showed you the challenges. Main challenge was we had to prepare the SSR twice, in two different patterns, entirely different patterns that was the major challenge that we had. Then we had no forerunners. Now Loyola College is conducted the symposium and many NAAC accredited institutions would come attend and clarify your doubt. But ours was one of the few institutions in the country to go for the new format accreditation. So we have nobody to talk to nobody to ask to we had to find our own solutions, so that was another challenge. Then again as I told you we became autonomous only in 2014 and our assessment period started from 2012, so two years we were under the affiliated status and after that it was autonomous. So it was really difficult when we try to tackle certain questions, it was really difficult, so since the period consisted of both these things. Then the documentation of course was a very very major challenge as you know because even though we prepare AQR annually, you know when it comes to the actual SSR preparation, documents, collecting proofs, the file size challenges, geo tag photos, all these things were really the challenges and we manage somehow. But I must tell you the team work was our strength and still it is the strength. Entire college starting from Manager to the non teaching staffs, students all of them join hands as one mind to make this possible

8. **Question:** please clarify the concept of e databases in library, will Nlist membership served purpose?

Response: Regarding the databases that was one of our weak areas but we do have an Nlist in the library. It does not serve for all the e-resources but it was useful for research scholars they can get many references they want, does not serve for all. One of the suggestions by the NAAC team was to strengthen the databases in our library. So that was one of our grey areas. We already started working on that.

9. **Question:** is it mandatory that all the documents uploaded have to be signed by the head of the institution?

Response: Yes, we did so, it is compulsory I think all the documents are to be signed by but if a document speak for itself I don't think it is necessary. For example if it a

certificate well I don't think it is necessary. But other documents are to be certified by the head of the institution.

10. **Question:** How is the Research related functions works in Theresa?

Response: TRAC is our research cell sir. Theresian Research and Consultancy Cell. So TRAC promotes and coordinate all the research activities of the college. It initiates all the research activities we have an annual symposium for all the research scholars and research guides. Then it has instituted or marked the management aided research project to ensure the research scholars progress all such things are under the TRAC. All the research activities of the institution are coordinated or monitored by TRAC.

11. **Question:** please pour some light on active MoU and their documentation.

Response: Well, documentation is not a problem because in MoU we have a certified agreement. So that can be uploaded as the document for MoU. So you don't need a separate document for that.

12. **Question:** The question is regarding the activities conducted under the MoU, that is merged with each particular MoU, the main, certified document of the MoU, then the detail of the activity conducted under that particular MoU.

Response: We have in a stamp paper both party will agree on certain palms, this will be done from our ends and those will be done from the other party's end, then both will be there will be a validity period if the MoU is within the validity period we call it an active or functional MoU and that is sufficient document, we uploaded only that as a document.

13. **Question:** Can you pour light on NAAC SOP

Response: NAAC SOP is available in the website along with each question a standard operating procedure is given out to address the question and all there.

14. **Question:** Can you explain the activities of the college based on the location advantages and disadvantages.

Response: Well location advantage, we are at the heart of the city, as I told you in one of my slides, we are centrally located and that is the greatest advantage, easy accessibility so people can easily reach there. And the greatest disadvantage is also the same being at the center it is very difficult to find space for expansion, so vertical expansion is the only possible means of expansion. As I told you during the assessment period we are able to purchase some land and construct a new building so the limitation of space is always been our disadvantage being at the centre of the city. Easy accessibility to students, teachers and others are the greatest advantage I feel as far as location is concerned. So the students get a lot of opportunities to see the things happening around.

15. **Question:** In criterion 7, there is a question to list the activities based on the location advantage and disadvantage. There is a question like that, what did you answer for the same?

Response: Okay, I don't exactly remember what activities did we answer for that particular question, if you leave your email id with the coordinator I can send you the

answer because it has been nearly three years and I don't exactly remember what actually we did give for that particular question. I will definitely send answer to Jasmine ma'am.

SESSION 3 – DR. SUNIL C MATHEW

1. **Question:** I have heard from other colleges that, the peer team is not differentiating between qualitative and quantitative matrix separately. Is that true? But according to you are saying we only need to concentrate on the qualitative matrix. I would like to know what the reality is.

Response: I have already told you that, the peer team is supposed to give marks for the qualitative matrix only, but you can present some quantitative data in order to impress them. So that will definitely make an impression about your college in them. So in order to generally impress them you can use the quantitative data where you have performed well. If you have high pass results or if your students are securing ranks in the university examinations, or you are publishing a great number of research works, that will give you an advantage, an edge while they give marks for the qualitative aspects. But specifically they go back to their stay and they are entering marks for each and every matrix, what they are doing, is giving marks to the qualitative matrix, what are the strategies for analyzing and assessing the learning levels of students that is the question. So during the departmental presentation you have to present all the qualitative matrix. So each and every qualitative matrix are answered in the department presentation, those presentation, your answers will come to their mind. While they sit before the NAAC portal for entering the marks. They are proposed to give marks for the qualitative matrix but you can include if there is time and they permit you could have include quantitative data also in order to impress them.

2. **Question:** can you speak on choice of optional matrix

Response: That depends definitely on the colleges. We have omitted some awards received for extension activities. Also some training programs organized for such things.

Optional matrix varies from colleges to college. You answer all the questions in SSR. After all that, there is a provision to evaluate all your response. NAAC will give you feedback about your response, because some calculation will take place, while you enter your data. Those things if you are not performing well, you can avoid. For example, number of research papers, if you want to get marks for that each and every faculty should publish at least one paper every year. It will be difficult. So if you avoid that will be better. So based on the analysis that you do on the other colleges self study report you will get some idea definitely, but basically it depends on your performance, your college and your data. My advice is that you fill all the matrix, after filling up the SSR, with utmost care by entering all the data you have, put maximum data, answer all the matrix, upload all the data. And then take every matrix one by one. Convenient way to IQAC take each and every matrix. We shall get full marks. Analyze it. Some of your colleague may tell that. Cross check with the data in SSR of other colleges. Check what are the data they have given. This college is 25 data and getting full marks, so you giving 30 we will also get full marks. That should be the strategy, take each and every matrix. Student enrollment and profile, you can see that 90 percent, you will get full marks. Don't worry about that, go for the next activities we have only number of extension activities five each in a year we shall get full marks, go through the SSR of some other colleges. For which they have scored full marks in the extension activities, you will get the idea of key indicator or you will get the mark of every matrix you can go through it and find every matrix. If they got full marks you will definitely get it. The NAAC has no partiality. So based on that you can decide which should be the optional matrix. It should be based on collective exercise, you have to do some work

3. **Question:** what was the biggest challenges during DVV process?

Response: Biggest challenge before me was, we have a lot of certificates, from the university. They asked us to give the full list of students enrolled or admitted countersigned by the registrar of the university, list of outgoing students, pass percentage sealed and signed by the controller of examinations, lot of such things, some minutes of the university, so I want to get some thirteen documents from the university, they asked. They were not satisfied, the DVV partner was not satisfied with the data submitted from the college, they asked further clarification, they want to clarify it. So our enrollment percentage was more than 90, so asked us to give the data from the university. That was the biggest challenge before me. And they have raised the query about the 95 percentage of questions. We got 64 questions during the DVV process. It is only sixty quantitative matrix, but including some questions from the extended profile I have to answer. So there were 64 questions I have to answer. Within 15 days, they give only 15 days to answer the 64 questions that was the biggest challenge, with the help of, with the support of all my colleagues we could submit the answers in time.

4. **Question:** related to that question in your analysis can you say that DVV process is objective?

Response: They are not believing us, they asked a lot of questions, they think that all this data are fake. Based on that they are asking questions, they are not satisfied with the data submitted by the college. So they want extra or additional supporting documents. So we could give all those, there was nothing fake or nothing wrong in our answers to the or in our SSR. Everything is there. That was my analysis, but something is there, I want to tell you one thing see this DVV team is not from the academic wing, they may be computer professionals. They are not aware of these academic activities actually going on in a college. Suddenly they might have students studied in a college, but that is not enough, but that will create a lot of problem to us. See for the answers to some DVV questions you need not to object them. There must be some questions, number of research guides, we gave them the numbers and number of students got PhD. During the DVV process they objected that the number of guides is not ok. That number of guides is not in your college. They will count only the number of guides who got recognition during the last assessment period only. So they will not count those guides who have guide ship in the previous assessment period. They will count only the guides who got recognition during the last five years. But unfortunately they will reject the arguments about other guides during the SSR. At the same time they accepted all the students who got PhD during the last five years. So I have given all the supporting documents of all the PhD scholars who were awarded PhD during the last five years. But they didn't accept the number of research guides. That I didn't object or challenge the DVV partner, why? See that as the fault from the DVV partner, you also not have to challenge it. Because the number of research scholars per guide will be more. The number of research guide is comes in the denominator, as a mathematics teacher I didn't objected it because the formula given in the SSR, you please go through the formula also, how they evaluate the mark. The number of PhDs produced divided by the number of research guides. Number of research guides is coming in the denominator. So I told them there are 55 but they told me there is only 15 okay no problem. The data will be higher, I didn't object. But some of the colleges objected it. They challenged it they produce documents, but I didn't go for that, and fortunately we got full marks for that. It was a fault from the DVV partner, but why should I bother about them. They are saying that this much is your ratio in PhD production. Okay, actually there is only one or two, but they are saying that it is more than 10. So why should I challenge. So when we get these questions we should go through that also. There are some questions we have to challenge it. But one thing I challenged them. They told me that the number of students participated for the extension activities is 3500. But I told them there are not that much students in our college. What they have done is. They added all the number of students in all the activities. But there are duplication, some students may participate in different activities, more than one activity. So it is not fair to count like that. So I pointed out that. They accepted it. Why should I pointed out that is because it affects the number of students in our college. It is interlinked. You see there are some derived matrix, some matrix are connected with some

other matrix, they are interlinked. So you know you go through that also. With a mathematical mind you should evaluate all those things. All the answers in some matrix are reflected in some others also. So such matrix you have to find out, so that should be go in clarity, when the DVV question you will see that. Associated matrix or related matrix. Your answer to 4.1 may reflect in 4.2 also. So they are associated, those questions you have to very careful and give answers to same number of answers to all such things. There may be some problem with the system, with the computer. Because we are getting system generated form for the quantitative matrix. System should say it is fine

5. **Question:** Do we have to change the IQAC coordinator every two years as per NAAC.

Response: There is no need to change the IQAC coordinator, but IQAC should be reconstituted at the time of completion of two years. We can retain the higher IQAC there is no problem in it. Even the members can be retained, but the IQAC should be reconstituted. The period of an IQAC is only two years, we can retain the IQAC coordinator also if you want, and also the entire team if you want.

6. **Question:** can we see matrix wise answers of results declared by the institutions?

Response: Yes, definitely. After the declaration the NAAC will send us the mark that you are going to score in each of this 96 matrix, what is your mark that will be intimated to you and your college personally.

7. **Question:** how do we know number of activities we have to conduct to get full marks?

Response: That is what I said earlier, you kindly go through the SSR of some other colleges. Analyze the marks that they have scored. From that you can have an idea about the number of activities. I don't know whether NAAC will change that bench mark. Whether NAAC is changing benchmark during the interval side or not, that I don't know.

8. **Question:** while giving the pass percentage shall we add the number of students who got passed in later year?

Response: Pass percentage you can add, provided university will give you. I have added. After the publication of results only the University is giving some grace marks to the students. NCC or NSS students. Also some students failed during the second semester will qualify after publishing the sixth semester results. Because the second semester results announces some weeks later than sixth semester results. So that may not be reflected in you final results, so that may not be those students who are already passed in the final year also, so it may take some time. So you can also point out those to the controller of the examinations by giving the certificate of pass and they will definitely gave you the certificate of pass so what we have to give the NAAC is the certificate of the pass percentage sealed and signed by the controller of examinations. If the controller of the examinations is giving you the pass percentage including and the number of students passed in the subsequent years, then you can submit no problem. We have submitted based on the data given by the controller of examinations, if you give an application with the controller of examinations they give you the pass percentage. In each of the programs in your college, that data I have submitted to them.

9. **Question:** progression some students were passed in 2016 might have gone for higher studies in later years, shall we add their numbers along with 2016 progression?
Response: Progression to higher studies we can include those who gone for higher studies during the last five years but you point out that those who study in your college may be two year back. You can include all the students who studied during the assessment period. Number of students who had gone for higher studies and who have studied in your college during the period can be included. May be student who studied in 2013 may go for higher studies in 2015, if those two years are there in your assessment period then you can include it.
10. **Question:** do we need to give a list of participating student of each program?
Response: Yes definitely, during the DVV process they have asked. It is better you give the list of students attendance sealed and signed by the principal and coordinator of the program. In respect of each of the programs were asked during the DVV process
11. **Question:** Do we have to give them a participant list of every program we have conducted?
Response: Participant list as well as the attendance signed by the students.
12. **Question:** it is a new order, so will it apply to the previous years that is 2014, 2015?
Response: Yes, it applies to all the years, for each programs you should be prepare what are the things needed for each program brochure or circular of the program, report of the program, photo of the programs, list of the participants, attendance list signed by the students. These things should be given. In addition you can give paper cuttings, social media publicity if you have.
13. **Question:** those students who pass prior to accreditation period and qualify JRF during assessment period can be counted?
Response: Yes, no problem you claim them. The year of pass of JRF is what you should have.
14. **Question:** is there any evaluation difference for colleges in rural areas and urban areas?
Response: That I don't know because the peer team visit they may get impressed during the situation of the college. Actually as per the regulation there is no distinction.
15. **Question:** would you please share a list of certificates we have to collect from the university.
Response: Based on the DVV process, I can give the list of students who got admitted sealed and signed by the registrar. List of outgoing students, and in the morning session some of the speakers mentioned it. Affiliation certificate for all the programs, and other certificates include all your programs are under CBCS and pass percentage of students.
16. **Question:** can a student's progression and employment count if a student pursue PG and then joined for Job, can we add both pg and job as the progression in criteria 5?
Response: Definitely you can. Progression means progression to higher studies, if their students gone for job how can you include in the progression to higher studies. If a student did UG in your college and after UG that student moved for PG in your college or

wherever, you can include that student into the progression to higher studies. After PG doing in your college that student got appointment you can include his name in the placement list. If he did PG in other college we can't include in placement list. Placement is for outgoing students in your institution.

17. **Question:** do we have to give pass certificate from the university while submitting SSR or if only DVV asked for it?

Response: You have to submit it with the SSR.

18. **Question:** what about multiple placement of the same students, will they all count?

Response: No, only one you can count.

19. **Question:** a clarity regarding the answer you said earlier, an UG student passed out from your college in 2017 and later joined for PG in some other college and after that he got placed. All these come under same assessment period. Don't you think there is logic in it?

Response: Yes there is you can claim, give the pass certificate, employment certificate and field of study in UG. From the DVV experience what I can tell that they give only final year students who got placement immediately after the period of study. But you can claim, it is our right to claim for maximum marks. Simply claim it and give the supporting documents. If the placement certificate is with you, though the student studied three years back, no problem you simply claim it. If they allow we will get marks, or there is nothing to lose.

20. **Question:** please advice how to collect data and documents from various units of the college?

Response: I collected all the data through email, I prepared this data template into document, because word document was familiar to most of the faculty members and only few were familiar with the excel sheet. So I converted all the data from excel to doc format or word format, and I gave them those documents and ask them to fill and send it back to me. So they represent was under the IQAC and collected all the data from various units especially from faculty members, coordinators of various programs, teachers in charge of various clubs and head of the departments and faculties who are publishing and all the teachers I have send these format prepared in word format through email and collected the data.

21. **Question:** during this pandemic situation we are all using the online facilities, ICT facilities we have incorporated in our college. My doubt is if we don't have a smart class facility, then will it actually affects the grade of our college? If there is no e-content development facility centre will it affect the grade?

Response: If there is no e-content development facility center It will not affect the grading, but you can have a good number of ICT facilities in good number of classrooms with the LED presenters. Ask your teachers to start moodle classes. There are free websites which will provide free access to moodle classes. Most of the faculty members can join and create their moodle classes. And give the login details in your

website. You can prepare moodle classes may be for free. The login facility should be given in your college website. By enabling that strategy you can remedy it. In our college also there is no LMS what I have done is this strategy.

22. **Question:** suppose our present accreditation is due on May 2022, our assessment period is from 2017 to 2022, we have to last six months of the validity period. Then wont if it is difficult to includes complete documentation of complete 2021- 2022, last assessment year before SSR submission, because they tell to keep SSR ready while submitting IIQA.

Response: After completion of preparing the, only by preparing SSR completely you go for IIQA, don't go for IIQA without preparing SSR. That is my advice, prepare SSR completely, then only you go for IIQA, if you submit IIQA promptly and you will get a positive note from the NAAC within 10 days. After 10 days your countdown will start, 45 days of submitting SSR, only go for IIQA after preparing SSR completely. That is my advice, even if it is 2021 don't worry you can take one or two or three months that will not affect you NAAC accreditation.

23. **Question:** how is the overlapping dipping the criteria avoided or do DVV process take serious notes of overlapping?

Response: Overlapping is there in the matrix and programs you want to mention in more than one matrix you can. DVV is not bother about that, but you have to give the supporting documents.

24. **Question:** that is if we quote one activity in one matrix what about quoting it in another matrix?

Response: See that thing will definitely, such things are not rare in the case of quantitative matrix, but some activities that you are mentioning in quantitative aspects can be placed in qualitative, because the peer team is not going to evaluate each and everything quantitative. So when you give data, take a note that you give separate activities in different quantitative matrix. There should not be any repetitive in the quantitative domain but you can give one matrix in the quantitative as well as in the qualitative.

25. **Question:** how many AQAR we have to submit in a five year duration.

Response: You have to submit at least four AQAR, you can avoid the last AQAR. So the last assessment year is 2021-2022, so it is not required. But all other AQARs are needed.

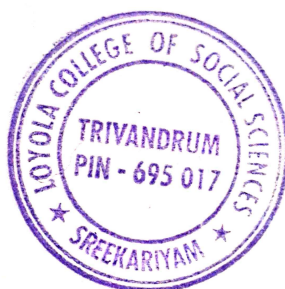

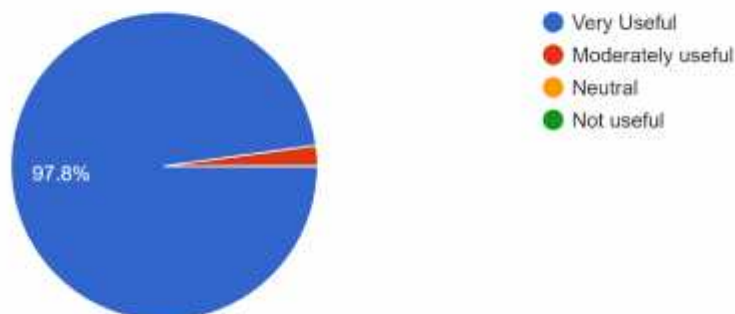

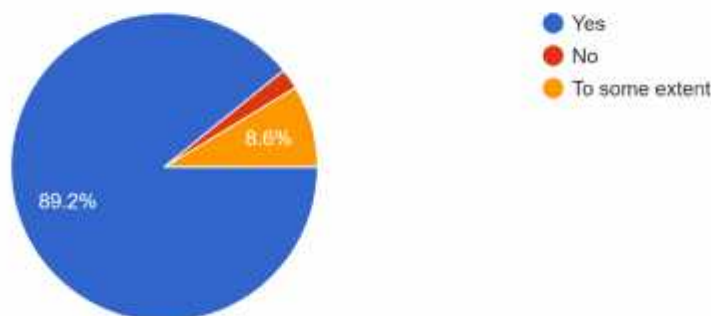
