1. GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 PROGRAMMES OFFERED FOR STUDY

Each Postgraduate Programme offered at Loyola College of Social Sciences extends for a period of two years/ four semesters. The Programme of study shall be by regular attendance for the requisite number of lectures, practical training and other academic requirements. The PG Programmes offered by Loyola College of Social Sciences [Autonomous] under the aided streams are given below:

1.2 GENERAL RULES OF THE COLLEGE

- All the students are compulsorily required to have their identity cards with them while they are on campus. Wearing of identity tag in College is mandatory as per Government Order G.O.No.26483/ G1/15/H.Edn dated 12.10.2015. Identity cards will be issued by the College after the admission.
- Students should keep all the receipts obtained from the College safely and should produce them for verification if required. Students leaving the College after enrolment will have to pay the fee for the whole semester.
- Caution deposit of a student will be refunded only on surrendering the original receipt of the remittance.
- Students admitted to the College should strictly abide by the rules and regulations of the College.
- The College works under the full-day system from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm (subject to periodic Government / University directions. Besides lecture classes, there will be Seminars, Tutorials, Club/ Extension activities, Group Discussions, Counselling, NSS and Life Orientation Programmes.
- At the beginning of the morning session before the commencement of classes, there will be a bell, the first bell, when students should go to their respective classes and occupy their seats. Every day the classes shall begin with a one-minute silent prayer. When the bell for the prayer, the second bell, is heard, all students shall stand up; those still moving around outside the class shall stand still in their place in a prayerful attitude.

- Students who intend to avail of any kind of leave, other than emergency leave, shall inform and get prior permission from the Faculty Advisor for the same.
 - If a student is found to have indulged in ragging, strict action will be taken against that student. (vide Hon'ble Supreme Court Order No.SAP(c)No. 24295/2004). Smoking/ chewing, use of tobacco, pan parag, drugs, alcohol, and all such products that are either banned, illicit or injurious to health, are strictly prohibited inside the College campus. Nobody shall enter the college campus after ingesting alcohol/ drugs or under intoxication.
 - The College Management bans political activities on college campuses and forbids students from organising or attending meetings other than official ones within the College campus, based on the verdict of the Division Bench of Hon. High Court of Kerala.
 - Use of mobile phones is restricted inside the College Campus (vide Government of Kerala Rt. No. 1102/05/H.Edn). In the event of any violation of the above, action will be taken including confiscation of the device and imposition of fine.
 - Nobody shall disrupt the academic atmosphere of the College under any circumstances. Any such activities that may hamper the academic ambience of the institution will be seriously dealt with. Such misconduct would entail major punishment including expulsion from college. If necessary, criminal prosecution also will be invoked.
 - Destruction of College properties would entail civil as well as criminal proceedings against delinquents.
 - Nobody shall instigate or engage in activities such as strikes, demonstrations, agitation, slogans shouting etc. within the College campus.
 - College Union election will be conducted under an indirect mode /parliamentary system. No external or political interference shall be permitted.
 - All legal and reasonable grievances of the students will be addressed by the College authorities. In the event of any such grievance, the aggrieved can approach the respective Faculty Advisor or the Students' Grievances Redressal Committees existing in the College. The decision of the Principal shall be final.
 - Parents/Guardians are earnestly directed to make sure that their children abide by all the rules and regulations of the College. Parents should give their correct contact details at the time of admission. There shall be Parents' Meeting/ Open Houses at least once a semester as a matter of practice.
 - Decency and decorum in attire is expected of all students.
 - Students are strictly warned against loitering outside classrooms or just outside the campus during class hours. They shall either remain in class or spend their time in the library.
 - Students are earnestly discouraged from bringing their four-wheelers to the campus. Those students who come on two-wheelers should necessarily wear helmets in and outside the campus. Not more than two persons shall travel in two-wheelers. Two-wheelers should be parked in the parking area assigned by the management.
- 2.** The College offers personal mentoring for students. The mentor is a guide, friend, and philosopher for the students on the campus. Apart from teacher mentors, there is a full-time professional Counselling Psychologist in the College. Students are directed to seek the assistance of mentors and counsellors if and when needed. Parents are also requested to contact the counselling psychologists for any needs of their children.

Attendance and Eligibility for End Semester Examinations

75% aggregate attendance for Boys and 73 % aggregate for girls for each course in a semester is mandatory for a student to be eligible to register for the respective End Semester Examination

- Attendance will be recorded programme-wise on an hourly basis
- Students must secure the minimum aggregate attendance percentage prescribed for each course in order to be eligible to appear for the end semester examinations.
- A privilege of condonation may be granted up to a maximum of 10% shortage of attendance, subject to submission of appropriate supporting documents.
- This condonation facility will be permitted only once during the entire programme period.

ADMISSION REGULATIONS

2.1 ADMISSION PROCESS

Any candidate seeking admission to Loyola College of Social Sciences (Autonomous) should apply through the College website irrespective of the category.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

2.1.1 BASIC ELIGIBILITY

Eligibility for admissions and reservation of seats for various Post Graduate Programmes shall be according to the rules framed by the University/ College from time to time ["Notwithstanding anything contained in the University Statutes, the selection of students shall be governed by the rules prescribed by the Government from time to time with the concurrence of the University in respect of such admissions"].

Similarly, no student shall be eligible for various PG Programmes unless s/he has completed a three-year Bachelor's degree course recognized by the University of Kerala in the appropriate discipline or its equivalent as recognized by the University of Kerala.

2.1.2 NATIVITY

All candidates applying for admission to Loyola College of Social Sciences (Autonomous) should be citizens of India. All such candidates are categorized as KERALITE or NON- KERALITE.

A candidate of Kerala origin will be categorized as a KERALITE. Children of All India Service Officers allotted to Kerala Cadre are deemed to be Keralites as per G.O. (Rt) No.822/08/H.Edn dated 9-5-2008. But they will not be eligible for communal/special reservations.

A candidate who does not come under the Keralite category will be categorized as NON-KERALITE.

- To prove that a candidate is an Indian citizen of Kerala origin for the limited purpose of eligibility for admission, he/she has to produce any one of the following certificates at the time of admission.
- In the case of candidates who have undergone schooling in Kerala, a course certificate from the head of the educational institution last attended in Kerala, certifying that the candidate has undergone his/her studies in Kerala for not less than 3 (three) years within a continuous period of 12 (twelve) years.
OR
- A certificate from the Village Officer/ Tahsildar to show that he/she or his/her mother/father was born in Kerala.
OR
- Certificate from the Village Officer/Tahsildar to the effect that the candidate has been a resident of Kerala State for a period of five years within a continuous period of twelve years
OR
- The true copy of the relevant page of the Secondary School Leaving Certificate showing the candidate's Place of Birth in Kerala.

OR

- f. The true copy of the relevant page of the Secondary School Leaving Certificate showing the Place of Birth in Kerala of either of the parents of the candidate with a corroborative certificate to establish the relationship between the parent and the candidate.

OR

- g. The true copy of the relevant page of the Passport of the candidate, issued by the Government of India, showing the Place of Birth in Kerala or of either of the parents of the candidate showing Place of Birth in Kerala with corroborative certificate to establish the relationship between the parent and the candidate.

Non-Keralites should furnish a copy of the Certificate of Nativity from the revenue authority or local body concerned at the time of admission.

2.1.3 ADMISSION GUIDELINES

1. While making enquiries, please quote your application number, the name of the applicant and the programme applied for.

Candidates provisionally selected for admission to all programmes should appear for an interview at the Principal's office. Selection will be finalised only after the interview. **The Principal reserves the right to refuse admission to any applicant if found ineligible for admission according to the regulations of the University and the Management.**

- i) The applicant must be accompanied by his/her parent(s) at the time of the interview and should produce the following documents:
- ii) A printed copy of the downloaded Admission Memo.
- iii) Printed copy of the downloaded Application Form.
- iv) The Transfer Certificate in original.
- v) The original Pass certificate (if applicable) and mark list of the qualifying examination.
- vi) Candidates from Universities other than the University of Kerala should produce a Migration Certificate from their respective Universities and an Eligibility Certificate from the Kerala University.
- vii) Certificate of character and conduct from the Head of the Institution last attended.
- viii) Copy of the qualifying examinations passed [Degree, SSLC/10th, Plus two]
- ix) S.C./ S.T./ O.E.C. candidates should produce recent (with one-year validity) community certificates from the Tahsildar/ Village Officer and O.B.C. candidates should produce community and income certificates from the Village Officer.
- x) Candidates seeking admission through Management quota to any Programme should also follow the guidelines specified for eligibility and admissions.
- xi) Catholic students, who wish to be considered for Community Merit Quota should apply online and bring a letter from the Parish Priest at the time of admission.
- xii) Those who are granted admission should pay the fee immediately.
- xiii) Seats are reserved for outstanding performers in the field of sports and for differently abled persons as per university regulations
- xiv) Parents or guardians of the admitted candidates are expected to join the Parent-Teacher Association of the College.
- xv) All candidates for admission must acquaint themselves with the rules and regulations of Loyola College of Social Sciences (Autonomous) and will be bound by them if admitted.

2.1.4 CATEGORIZATION OF SEATS

In due consideration of the Direct pay agreement mentioned in Section 2.4.1, seats available in the College are mainly classified as Merit Seats, Community Seats, Management Seats and Reservation Seats.

- a. MERIT SEATS: The seats that are filled by the College purely based on merit are classified as “Merit Seats”.
- b. COMMUNITY SEATS: The seats that are filled by the College based on merit among candidates of the community of the Management who runs the College (Catholics), are classified as ‘Community Seats’.
- c. MANAGEMENT SEATS: The seats that are filled by the Management are classified as “Management Seats”.
- d. RESERVATION SEATS: The seats which are earmarked for SC/ST/PWD/ Transgender/Sports persons are classified as “Reservation Seats”.

2.1.5 RESERVATION OF SEATS

A candidate can claim only any one of the reservation benefits/ seats from within any one the types listed below.

2.1.6 TYPES OF RESERVATION

Seats will be reserved for the following categories for various PG Programmes:

- a. RESERVATION FOR NOMINEES
- b. RESERVATION FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES
- c. SPECIAL RESERVATION AND
- d. MANDATORY RESERVATION

a. RESERVATION FOR NOMINEES:

RESERVATION FOR CANDIDATES FROM THE UNION TERRITORY OF LAKSHADWEEP.

An additional seat shall be created for each PG Programme (wherever necessary), exclusively to accommodate students sponsored by the Union Territory of Lakshadweep. This seat shall not be filled up by other candidates [Govt. letter No.5455/b3/2006/H.Edn. dated 15-03-2006] [U.O. No. AcB/1/1134/2006 dated 26-4-2006].

RESERVATION FOR CANDIDATES FROM JAMMU & KASHMIR

Two seats shall be created over and above the sanctioned strength to accommodate candidates belonging to Jammu & Kashmir for admission to PG programmes (wherever necessary) as per UO No. Ac B1/2292/Adms/2012 dated 01.03.2013. Such students should also register online.

CONCESSION FOR WARDS OF KASHMIRI MIGRANTS

The following relevant concessions are applicable for wards of Kashmiri Migrants for admission to the PG programmes – U.O.No.Ac.B1/910/ Admns/2012, dated 09/04/2012.

- Extension in date of admission by about 30 days.
- Relaxation in cut-off percentage up to 10% subject to minimum eligibility requirement.
- Increase in intake capacity up to 5% course-wise.
- Waiving of domicile requirements.
- Facilitation of migration in second and subsequent years

RESERVATION FOR INMATES OF GOVERNMENT CHILDREN'S HOME

One seat shall be created over and above the sanctioned strength for Inmates of the Government Children's Home and Establishment as per UO.No. Ac B1/ 055682/2012 dated 30.04.2013

RESERVATION OF SEATS FOR THE WIDOWS /WARDS OF ARMED FORCES OF PERSONNEL, KILLED/DISABLED IN ACTION DURING PEACETIME

Additional seats over and above the sanctioned strength may be created as and when required for the widows /wards of Armed Forces Personnel, killed or disabled in action during peacetime, in Institutions under the purview of the Ministry of Human Resource Development as per UGC policy.



b. RESERVATION FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES (PWD)

5% seats of the sanctioned strength shall be created, over and above, exclusively for Physically Handicapped candidates in Government/Aided Colleges (as per clause 32(1) of chapter VI, The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016).

As per Clause 2 (r), Chapter I of the Persons with Disabilities Act 2016, "Person with benchmark disability" means a person with not less than 40% of a specified disability where specified disability has not been defined in measurable terms and includes a person with disability where specified disability has been defined in measurable terms, as certified by the certifying authority. Candidates who have a minimum of 40% disability alone will be eligible to apply for this quota. Candidates seeking admission under the PWD category should submit the "Certificate of disability", issued not earlier than 5 years (Only for temporary disability) before the submission of the application, by the District Medical Board or bodies of higher status, certifying the degree of percentage of disability. The Permanent Disability Card issued by the State Government is also considered.

Based on the details furnished in the online application, candidates will be provisionally included under the "Persons with Disability" category.

In the case of Specific Learning Disability (SLD), even though the percentage of disability is not mentioned in the disability certificate, it should be treated as a benchmark disability according to the RPWD Act 2016.

- The selection of candidates under this category will be based on the rank in the inter- se merit list and not based on the degree of disability.

c. RESERVATION FOR TRANSGENDER CANDIDATES

Two seats shall be created over and above the sanctioned strength in all courses for admitting Transgender students. [G.O.(Ms)No.153/2018 HEdn dated 03.07.2018]. Such candidates should submit transgender identity card issued by the State Government at the time of admission.

d. SPECIAL RESERVATION

SPORTS QUOTA

One seat over and above the sanctioned strength shall be created for Sports candidates in the PG Programme. Admission to such seats shall be made by the Principal, as per the existing procedure for admission under Sports Quota. If the required number of sportspersons is not available, the seats should be kept vacant and shall not be filled by other candidates. [U.O.No. Ac.B1/2004 dated 08- 07-2005].

NORMS FOR SELECTION

- Preference shall be given to the sportsperson who has represented at the International level, over the National level, over the State level, over the sportsperson who has represented the District. In the absence of candidates who have represented the State, the Sportsperson with District representation can be considered for filling up the quota.
- The certificate from the Hon. Secretary of the State Association of the concerned event
- must be produced by the candidate to prove the State representation and from the Hon. Secretary; the District Association of the concerned event must be produced by the candidate to prove the representation of the District. [Circular Letter No. Ad.D1.3.1276/74 dated 23-01-1979]
- The selection of candidates under the sports quota is based on their excellence in Sports at the Degree level.
 - Selected candidates in the Sports quota are bound to represent the College in the event/game of their specialization during their period of study in the College.
 - The above candidates should also register online before the closure of registration. The rank list will be prepared based on the achievement in sports and published separately on the College Notice board and Website. Candidates will be called for interviews separately.

ARTS QUOTA

Students who are declared as Kalaprathibha / Kalathilakam of the University of Kerala in any year during their Degree programme, during the succeeding academic year shall be admitted to the PG programme even by creating seats over and above the sanctioned strength.



2.2 AGREEMENT FOR DIRECT PAYMENT: RELEVANT PROVISIONS FOR ADMISSION TO THE VARIOUS PROGRAMMES IN AIDED COLLEGES

As per Article 18 of the Agreement for Direct Payment entered into between the Government and the Educational Agencies of Private Colleges, admission of students to Loyola College of Social Sciences [Autonomous] shall be on the following basis:

* The seats under Community Quota will be filled on the basis of merit and on the basis of community certificate issued by the Parish Priest of the respective Latin Catholic / Malankara Catholic / Syrian Catholic parish.

** Candidates seeking admission under MQ should also attach a request letter addressed to the Manager alongwith application form for considering MQ seat. [See Annexure 8 for rules and policies of admission to Management quota]

CLAIMS FOR MANDATORY RESERVATION AND CERTIFICATES TO BE PRODUCED

- Claims for Mandatory Reservations must be made by a candidate at the time of submission of the online application. Candidates should mention their claim in the relevant columns in the Personal and Academic Data Sheet. They should also satisfy the eligibility conditions as per the Prospectus at the time of online registration.
- Candidates should produce all original documents to prove their claims made in the application form at the time of admission before the Principal. Claims that are not mentioned at the time of submission of the application will not be entertained even if supporting evidence is produced later on. The claims for mandatory reservation once made cannot be altered by the candidate under any circumstances.
- Warning: Those who produce false SC/ST Certificates for claiming reservation under SC/ST quota shall be liable for penalties as per rules.
- The seats unavailed by the SC candidates will go to ST candidates and vice versa.



CLAIM OF OEC CANDIDATES AGAINST THE UN-AVAILED SEATS OF SC/ST CANDIDATES

- Other Eligible Community (OEC) candidates who claim allotment to the unavailed seats, if any, under SC/ST quota should furnish community and income certificates obtained from the Village Officer/ Tahsildar. OEC candidates who possess a 'No Creamy Layer Certificate' obtained from the Village Officer/Tahsildar concerned alone are eligible for such seats.
- Converted Christians do not come under the SC/ST category. They belong to the OEC category. Refer to Annexure 4.

GENERAL RULE FOR MANDATORY RESERVATION

If sufficient candidates are not available to fill the seats reserved for SC/ST candidates, such seats will be filled as per Govt. / University rules.

The seats reserved under Differently Abled, Transgender and Sports Quota are created over and above the sanctioned strength. In the absence of the candidates who are eligible for these reservations, such seats will remain unfilled.

2.3 RULES FOR ADMISSION OF STUDENTS TO VARIOUS POST-GRADUATE

PROGRAMMES- Eligibility, Ranking and Weightage

The eligibility for admission to MSW & MAHRM Programmes is a pass with 50% marks in aggregate in the degree examination (including B.Tech, MBBS, BAMS, BHMS and L.L.B.) declared by the University of Kerala as equivalent thereto with 50% in Part III in the case of B.A., B.Sc. and B.Com. A weightage of 25% seats for BSW holders for MSW course.

MSW DISASTER MANAGEMENT

Graduation in any subject in the Faculties of Arts, Social Sciences, Science, Oriental Studies and Commerce securing not less than 45% marks in Part III - Optional Subjects. BBA Degree holders are also eligible.

The Postgraduate Entrance Examination 2026 will be conducted in two sessions to ensure a fair and comprehensive assessment of all applicants.

Session I (Common Test): 70 marks Time: 75 Min

This session is mandatory for all candidates, regardless of their chosen stream. It will consist of Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs) designed to evaluate: Logical and Reasoning Ability, Numerical Ability, English Language Competency, General Awareness


Session II (Stream-Specific Test): 30 marks Time: 30 Min

This session will be conducted in separate time slots for candidates applying to different streams. It will also consist of MCQs tailored to the subject areas of each stream:

Social Science Stream: Sociology, Social Work–Disaster Management, Human Resource Management (HRM), and Social Work

Science Stream: Psychology

By structuring the examination in two sessions—one common and one stream-specific—the test ensures that all candidates are assessed on general competencies while also being evaluated in their chosen academic discipline



2.4 STANDARDIZATION OF MARKS FOR ADMISSION TO POST-GRADUATE PROGRAMMES

PREPARATION OF RANK LIST

The rank list will be prepared based on marks obtained in the Loyola Common Entrance Test (LCET), Group Discussion, Interview and 30% Marks of first three semesters of the qualifying degree examination. All grades SGPA, SCPA and Annual Scheme [%] will be converted into 10 point scheme.

2.4.2 ADDITIONAL WEIGHTAGE

Weightage of marks will be given to the candidate as follows:

NCC Cadets

Candidates who have obtained the C Certificate are eligible for bonus marks. In addition, NCC cadets with at least 75% attendance during the course of study immediately preceding the programme for which admission is sought, and who have been awarded NCC certificates issued by the Directorate of NCC and duly signed by the Director, will also be eligible for bonus marks.

NSS Volunteers

Candidates who have obtained NSS certificates duly signed by the Vice-Chancellor and issued by the University, for completing 240 hours of work within two years during the course of study immediately preceding the programme for which admission is sought, will also be eligible for bonus marks.

Bonus Marks Calculation

For such candidates, 30% of five marks [i.e., 1.7 marks] will be added to the 30% of the qualifying examination marks, subject to a maximum ceiling of 30 marks.

Restriction

The benefit of bonus marks for admission can be availed only under one category—either NCC or NSS, not both.

b) There are no weightage/ grace marks for dependents of ex-servicemen for admission to PG Programmes.

2.4.3 RESOLVING OF TIE

In the case of more than one candidate obtaining equal index marks (Including weightage/ deduction, if applicable), the candidate who has scored more marks in Part III Main will be placed higher in ranking. If the tie persists, the candidate who has scored more marks in Part I / Part II English will be placed higher in the ranking.

If the tie persists the age of the candidates will be taken into account, the older being placed higher in the ranking. Even after this exercise, if the tie persists the alphabetical order of the first name of the candidates will be taken into account.

3.1. FEE CONCESSION

- SC/ST/OEC/OBH/Fishermen students are eligible for concession of tuition fees, special fees, exam fees, monthly stipend, and hostel fee.
- Applicants belonging to SC/ST/OEC/OBH or any other eligible categories should produce caste and income certificates from the Tahsildar concerned.
- OBC/General category students are eligible for concession for Tuition fees, Special fees, and Exam fees as per provisions of the Kumara Pillai Commission Report (income limited to Rs. One Lakh)
- All students eligible for fee concession should submit applications online (Govt. e- grants online portal) and submit the printout along with supporting documents to the College office within 15 days of their admission.

3.2 HOSTELS

Separate hostels for men and women are available. Admissions to hostels will be made only after the student is admitted to the College. Admission to the College does not guarantee hostel admission.

4. SPECIAL NOTICE ON RAGGING AS A CRIMINAL OFFENCE

4.1 PREVENTION OF RAGGING

Ragging is prohibited by law and is banned in the College. It is a criminal offence and anyone found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging is liable to be punished appropriately as per law/ UGC guidelines.

Students shall not indulge in any of the following activities, which are treated as ragging [Clause 3 of UGC Regulations]: Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
- Indulging in rowdy or in-disciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
- Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, torment or embarrassment to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students;
- Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other students by students;
- Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person.
- Any act of abuse by spoken words, e-mails, posts, or public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
- Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.
- Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the grounds of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background.

Reporting cases of ragging:

The complaints or information regarding ragging could be oral or written and even from third parties. The burden/responsibility of proving his/her innocence rests with the accused and not with the victim. Complaints can be lodged with the Principal, Staff Counsellors or any of the members of the Ragging Prevention Committee. All complaints/information received shall be kept strictly confidential. In the event of a student being booked for a criminal offence and being suspended from the college, he/she will be re-instated only after his/her obtains a clearance certificate from the concerned police officer.

Students are directed to report any incident of ragging forthwith to the respective Faculty Advisor of the Class or any member of the Anti-Ragging Committee, the Head of the Department or the Principal. Punishments:**At the Institution Level:**

Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the Institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the Institution Level shall be anyone or any combination of the following:

1. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
2. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
3. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
4. Withholding results.
5. Debarring from representing the Institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
6. Suspension/ expulsion from the hostel
7. Cancellation of admission.
8. Rustication from the Institution for a period ranging from One to Four semesters.
9. Expulsion from the Institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other Institution for a specified period.
10. Fine ranging between Rupees 25,000/- and Rupees 1 lakh.
11. Collective punishment: When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the Institution shall resort to collective punishment.

Admission to Management Quota (MQ) - Regulation/Policy

1. Only those students with more than 50% marks in the qualifying examinations will be considered for admission under MQ.
2. NRI students will be given MQ admission only if some close relative/guardian or family takes full responsibility and guardianship.
3. Community students seeking admission under MQ from outside Kerala should produce recommendation letters from concerned parish priests.
4. The one who recommends the candidate to MQ will be responsible for the conduct of the student. This will apply to all those who make a recommendation (including all those who are in the ecclesiastical as well as political and other spheres).
5. Candidates seeking admission under MQ should also attach a request letter addressed to the Manager alongwith application form for considering MQ seat.
